 Negative impact to the primary goal of developing a major Restaurant Communal Area

Primary Issue

Being the first Development of Robertson Street

- \circ $\;$ This Development fails to set a precedent for promoting a Community Hub
- 1. Most concerning about the DA is
 - $\circ \quad$ it does not address $\underline{\text{the goal}}$ of Robertson Street
 - o becoming the Newport central location
 - o of a <u>social/restaurant/entertainment</u> area
- 2. In fact it doesn't include any real acknowledgement of this primary goal for this crucial area.
- 3. References to the example of the thriving of multiple areas in Melbourne have been numerous.
 - This application provides zero contribution to any of the key elements of such successful areas.

Specific Issues

Robertson Street - negative contribution to community hub focus

1. None of the South Facing retail space planned on Robertson is <u>suitable/ideal</u> for restaurants.

2. The plan provides no space for gathering outside - instead is reduced to <u>narrowest</u> pedestrian space permitted.

Robertson Street - negative impact of vehicle entrance/exit for residential and deliveries

- 1. As planned a significant proportion of the Roberston Street South side ia devoted to car park and loading dock access.
- 2. This will significantly diminish even mitigate against community hub development

Robertson Street - Flagged Future Parking access

- 1. At the last public meeting the council hosted possible future parking access could be from Foamcrest.
- 2. The church was even mentioned as a possible location for this
- 3. Under no circumstance would the church approve this as it would significantly impact our open space which is the only available in the precinct.
- 4. A similar proposal of parking access from Foamcrest Avenue on redeveloped Post Office site is a poor solution.
