#### Reasons for referral

This application seeks consent for large/and or industrial development.

And as such, Council's Environmental Investigations officers are required to consider the likely impacts.

# Officer comments General Comments

The development proposes a number of external and internal alterations to the existing club that seek to alter a significant portion of the club.

Environmental Health does not object to the proposal generally however there are a number of concerns that are raised.

An acoustic report provided with the proposal documentation notes a number of "likely" in relation to noise emissions such as:

: "...Operational noise associated with patrons within the enclosed areas will be relatively contained by the building façade and roof which will be sealed, air conditioned and likely to include 6mm glazing...."

The report also speaks of"...Mitigation measures that are commonly employed to control noise emissions from mechanical plant..." and provdes a number of examples.

Additionally, there does not appear to be any specific recommendations contained within the report as to acoustic treatments required to assist in noise mitigation by built form and building design.

A significant portion of the premises is to be redeveloped, with the potential for a large amount of plant to be installed, ie ("...major mechanical noise sources associated with the development will be exhaust fans, new cooling tower, rooftop air conditioners, AHUs servicing the gaming areas, and new plant room to house new chiller, chilled water pumps and heat pump..."

Accordingly, Environmental Health is not confident at this stage that adequate assurances have been provided to assure that the development will not result in unwanted noise that has the potential to impact the community.

# CONDITIONS TO BE SATISFIED PRIOR TO THE ISSUE OF THE CONSTRUCTION CERTIFICATE

### **Mechnical Plant and Archtiectural Specifications**

Prior to the issue of a Construction Certificate, a detailed acoustic review shall be undertaken, once final plant selections and architectural specifications are confirmed, to ensure that the mitigation measures assumed in acoustic report acoustic report "NOISE AND VIBRATION IMPACT ASSESSMENT", reference RWDI # 2407558 version G dated 29 April 2025 by RWDI Australia Pty Ltd, submitted with the proposal are reflected in the final design.

Reason: To ensure noise impacts are mitigated by building elements and design.

# CONDITIONS THAT MUST BE ADDRESSED PRIOR TO ANY COMMENCEMENT

#### **Construction Noise and Vibration Management Plan**

Prior to commencement of any works, a Construction Noise and Vibration Management Plan is to be provided to the Principal Certifier.

The plan is to provide the necessary mitigation measures to reduce impact on surrounding properties throughout the demolition, excavation and construction phases of the development.

The plan is to incorporate recommendations as noted in the acoustic report "NOISE AND VIBRATION IMPACT ASSESSMENT", reference RWDI # 2407558 version G dated 29 April 2025 by RWDI Australia Pty Ltd.

The plan is to be complied with on an ongoing basis until such time that and Occupation Certificate for the development has been issued.

Reason: To ensure amenity impacts on nearby receivers are appropriately mitigated.

### **Acoustic Requirements - On-going**

Reason: To prevent a noise nuisance to any neighbouring residential receiver.
