My major objection to this proposal is the loss of critical habitat that our local endangered wildlife rely on.

I have always had a strong interest in the natural environment, which has resulted in a 25-year citizen science study of the species that live in and around McCarrs Creek Road.

I'm strongly against every tree being removed from this property as it will have a major impact on the animals that rely on this pristine bushland. At all costs, the native trees and vegetation should remain on the Council land. As the animals will be able to cross on the trees instead of the road and be killed by cars.

This block is abundant with species of diverse wildlife.
Glossy Black Cockatoos, Powerful Owls, Barking Owls, Echidnas, Wallabies, Feather tail gliders, Sugar gliders and Lyrebirds

What is proposed is totally out of character with the Church Point locale, and the Development should be rejected in its current form.

This is gross overdevelopment of such a beautiful bushland setting, and it will change the desired outlook of Church Point forever.
