To Whom It May Concern,

I write regarding the proposed modification of the approved DA2021/2083.

Proposed addition of pedestrian crossing to replace the approved footpath. I fail to see how a
pedestrian crossing would improve traffic flow on Forest Road, pedestrians have right of way
and, when students and teachers are entering or exiting the school, would hold up traffic. A
footpath won't stop traffic and vehicles won't be impeded. As anyone who traverses
Macpherson St, Angophora Circuit and Casurina Drive can confirm, traffic at school start and
finish times is at a standstill already. It can take over 20 minutes for me to get out onto

Macpherson St at these times. I note that the approved footpath was to be constructed by 31<sup>st</sup> January 2023 and question why Council has allowed this to be delayed by six months.

- 2. Proposed Changes to Traffic conditions on Forest Road.
  - a. I walk Forest Road almost daily; at most I've seen two boats or trailers on this street and think that their removal is not required.
  - b. Removing parking along Forest Way will push vehicle parking into the surrounding streets, streets that are already overloaded with School student and teacher parking. Despite the school proposed 'Green Travel' (supplied for DA2021/2083) there are more vehicles parked along Angophora Circuit and Callistemon Way than ever before, parking restrictions are not policed by Council resulting in no parking for non-school visitors during school hours.
  - c. While School might not have 'legal control over students' behaviour once they leave the school grounds', they do have a responsibility for them to and from school, why else do they have the Green Travel Plan or is this just lip service? Providing a teacher to stand at the entrance to the school to ensure they don't cross at the school entrance is a small measure to ensure safety of their students.

The school does not police the traffic flow in and around Angophora Circuit, so I assume that they do have the view that student and staff aren't their responsibility once they leave. They have taken the extra school fees but have provided little additional services to support the surrounding residents. In reading these proposed changes, it appears that the school is trying to provide solutions that are less cost to them at the expense of their neighbours.
