I would like to raise our concerns about the large development proposed for Hay Street.

Hay Street, is already heavily congested. It is basically a one way street, encouraging drivers and cyclists (as its a cycleway) to do some sort of disco dance as various ages of drivers try to get through the street. God help the existing residents, as they try to use their driveways. The overflow of parking and traffic flow has not been taken into consideration.

There is a current abundance of available over 55's accommodation in this suburb such as Willandra Village, Elizabeth Jenkins Place Aged Care and up the road Anzac Village. Also there's a new development in Collaroy main, which is yet to be completed.

My concern is twofold:

Infrastructure: there's no infrastructure to support the cars of the residents, who are clearly over 55. How do you propose the elderly access their driveways in a street which is currently a one way street?

Greenspace: I remember that we are supposed to have an allocation of land for nature. Is this something council have forgot about or have decided this is not part of planning any longer?

From reading all the submissions and the plans submitted, I see a large commercial development with no real consideration to the current concerns and stresses of the existing residents. Its inconsistent with the desired future character of the area, exceeds the considerations for 'low density, low impact'.
