I regularly walk from my home along the foreshore to North Harbour reserve and back and see this as a great spot to drop in for a cuppa and enjoy our foreshore. I've read some of the objections and believe they are unjust.

This is not a restaurant its a kiosk and noise will be minimal. We saw similar objections many years ago when we had a weekender at Cottage Point many neighbours objected to the small Kiosk extending its deck along the foreshore. It went ahead and today this kiosk has become a meeting place for neighbours and I will add includes those that objected who meet for a coffee and scone.
