# **DEFERRED COMMENCEMENT CONDITIONS**

### 1. Public Domain Upgrades - Plan Submission

Due to the narrow width of *Moorilla* the *local road portion of Pittwater* Road, and the intensification of the land use, the applicant will be required to widen *Moorilla* the local road portion of *Pittwater* Road along the length of the frontage to provide a 6.0m wide road. This will required to be undertaken along with the public domain upgrades including the footpath, kerb and gutter along this section.

Plans are to be prepared by a suitably qualified person and submitted to and approved by Council prior to the issue of a Construction Certificate.

**Note:** The applicant is to ensure the following dimensions are provided for the public domain upgrades:

- a minimum 1.5m wide footpath,
- a grass verge of a minimum 0.6m between the footpath and the boundary
- upgrade to the protection infrastructure opposite the site on Moorilla
   *Pittwater* Road.

Should the above dimensions require additional road reserve, the applicant shall be required to dedicate the necessary land to achieve the dimensions. This may result in a redesign of Block A to accommodate the boundary relocation.

Evidence required to satisfy the deferred commencement condition/s must be submitted to Council within five (5) years of the date of this consent, or the consent will lapse in accordance with Section 95 of the Environmental Planning and Assessment Regulation 2000.

Upon satisfaction of the deferred commencement condition/s, the following conditions apply:

#### 4. Prescribed Conditions

(a) All building works must be carried out in accordance with the requirements of the Building Code of Australia (BCA).

(b) BASIX affected development must comply with the schedule of BASIX commitments specified within the submitted BASIX Certificate (demonstrated compliance upon plans/specifications is required prior to the issue of the Construction Certificate);

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- (c) A sign must be erected in a prominent position on any site on which building work, subdivision work or demolition work is being carried out:
  - (i) showing the name, address and telephone number of the Principal Certifying Authority for the work, and
  - (ii) showing the name of the principal contractor (if any) for any building work and a telephone number on which that person may be contacted outside working hours, and
  - (iii) stating that unauthorised entry to the work site is prohibited.

Any such sign is to be maintained while the building work, subdivision work or demolition work is being carried out, but must be removed when the work has been completed.

- (d) Residential building work within the meaning of the Home Building Act 1989 must not be carried out unless the Principal Certifying Authority for the development to which the work relates (not being the Council) has given the Council written notice of the following information:
  - (i) in the case of work for which a principal contractor is required to be appointed:
    - A. the name and licence number of the principal contractor, and
    - B. the name of the insurer by which the work is insured under Part 6 of that Act,
  - (ii) in the case of work to be done by an owner-builder:
    - A. the name of the owner-builder, and
    - B. if the owner-builder is required to hold an owner-builder permit under that Act, the number of the owner-builder permit.

If arrangements for doing the residential building work are changed while the work is in progress so that the information notified under becomes out of date, further work must not be carried out unless the Principal Certifying Authority for the development to which the work relates (not being the Council) has given the Council written notice of the updated information.

- (e) Development that involves an excavation that extends below the level of the base of the footings of a building on adjoining land, the person having the benefit of the development consent must, at the person's own expense:
  - (i) protect and support the adjoining premises from possible

damage from the excavation, and

(ii) where necessary, underpin the adjoining premises to prevent any such damage.

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- (iii) must, at least 7 days before excavating below the level of the base of the footings of a building on an adjoining allotment of land, give notice of intention to do so to the owner of the adjoining allotment of land and furnish particulars of the excavation to the owner of the building being erected or demolished.
- (iv) the owner of the adjoining allotment of land is not liable for any part of the cost of work carried out for the purposes of this clause, whether carried out on the allotment of land being excavated or on the adjoining allotment of land.

#### 5. General Requirements

(a) Unless authorised by Council:

Building construction and delivery of material hours are restricted to:

- 7.00 am to 5.00 pm inclusive Monday to Friday,
- 8.00 am to 1.00 pm inclusive on Saturday,
- No work on Sundays and Public Holidays.

Demolition and excavation works are restricted to:

• 8.00 am to 5.00 pm Monday to Friday only.

(Excavation work includes the use of any excavation machinery and the use of jackhammers, rock breakers, excavators, loaders and the like, regardless of whether the activities disturb or alter the natural state of the existing ground stratum or are breaking up/removing materials from the site).

- (b) At all times after the submission the Notice of Commencement to Council, a copy of the Development Consent and Construction Certificate is to remain onsite at all times until the issue of a final Occupation Certificate. The consent shall be available for perusal of any Authorised Officer.
- (c) Where demolition works have been completed and new construction works have not commenced within 4 weeks of the completion of the demolition works that area affected by the demolition works shall be fully stabilised and the site must be maintained in a safe and clean state until such time as new construction works commence.
- (d) Onsite toilet facilities (being either connected to the sewer or an accredited sewer management facility) for workers are to be provided for construction sites at a rate of 1 per 20 persons.

(e) Prior to the release of the Construction Certificate, payment of the Long Service Levy is required. This payment can be made at Council or to the Long Services Payments Corporation. Payment is not required where the value of the works is less than

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\$25,000. The Long Service Levy is calculated on 0.35% of the building and construction work. The levy rate and level in which it applies is subject to legislative change. The applicable fee at the time of payment of the Long Service Levy will apply.

- (f) The applicant shall bear the cost of all works associated with the development that occurs on Council's property.
- (g) No building, demolition, excavation or material of any nature and no hoist, plant and

machinery (crane, concrete pump or lift) shall be placed on Council's footpaths, roadways, parks or grass verges without Council Approval.

- (h) Demolition materials and builders' wastes are to be removed to approved waste/recycling centres.
- (i) No trees or native shrubs or understorey vegetation on public property (footpaths, roads, reserves, etc.) or on the land to be developed shall be removed or damaged during construction unless specifically approved in this consent including for the erection of any fences, hoardings or other temporary works.
- (j) Prior to the commencement of any development onsite for:
  - i) Building/s that are to be erected
  - ii) Building/s that are situated in the immediate vicinity of a public place and is dangerous to persons or property on or in the public place
  - iii) Building/s that are to be demolished
  - iv) For any work/s that is to be carried out
  - v) For any work/s that is to be demolished

The person responsible for the development site is to erect or install on or around the development area such temporary structures or appliances (wholly within the development site) as are necessary to protect persons or property and to prevent unauthorised access to the site in order for the land or premises to be maintained in a safe or healthy condition. Upon completion of the development, such temporary structures or appliances are to be removed within 7 days.

- (k) Requirements for new swimming pools/spas or existing swimming pools/spas affected by building works.
  - (1) Child resistant fencing is to be provided to any swimming pool or lockable cover to any spa containing water and is to be consistent with the following;

not limited) to:

- (i) Swimming Pools Act 1992
- (ii) Swimming Pools Amendment Act 2009
- (iii) Swimming Pools Regulation 2008
- (iv) Australian Standard AS1926 Swimming Pool Safety

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- (v) Australian Standard AS1926.1 Part 1: Safety barriers for swimming pools
- (vi) Australian Standard AS1926.2 Part 2: Location of safety barriers for swimming pools.
- (2) A 'KEEP WATCH' pool safety and aquatic based emergency sign, issued by Royal Life Saving is to be displayed in a prominent position within the pool/spa area.
- (3) Filter backwash waters shall be conveyed to the Sydney Water sewerage system in sewered areas or managed onsite in unsewered areas in a manner that does not cause pollution, erosion or run off, is separate from the irrigation area for any wastewater system and is separate from any onsite stormwater management system.
- (4) Swimming pools and spas must be registered with the Division of Local Government.

Reason: To ensure that works do not interfere with reasonable amenity expectations of residents and the community. (DACPLB10)

#### 8. Construction, Excavation and Associated Works Security Bond (Road works)

#### 10. Amendments to the approved plans

- a) The bin room located within the May Road frontage is to be relocated to no more than 6.5 metres walking distance from the property boundary with the street.
- b) The bin room located within the May Road frontage is to have service access that is separate to the vehicular driveway.
- c) The bin room within Pittwater Road frontage is to be also relocated to no more than 6.5 metres walking distance from the property boundary with the street.
- d) The frosted section of the glass to the windows in Block E should be a fixed pane of glass (i.e. unopenable) with

#### permanent frosting.

Details demonstrating compliance are to be submitted to the Certifying Authority prior to the issue of the construction certificate.

The drainage plans must address the following:

 Provision of a minimum of 60.8 cubic metres of on-site detention storage, with flows attenuated by a 234mm diameter orifice.

Detailed drainage plans, including engineering certification, are to be submitted to the Certifying Authority for approval prior to the issue of the Construction Certificate.

Reason: To ensure appropriate provision for disposal and stormwater management arising from development.

#### 12. Submission Roads Act Application for Civil Works in the Public Road

The Applicant is to submit an application for approval for Infrastructure works on Councils roadway. Engineering plans for the new development works within the road reserve within this development consent are to be submitted to Council for approval under the provisions of Sections 138 and 139 of the Roads Act 1993. The application is to include four (4) copies of Civil Engineering plans for the design of civil works which shall be generally in accordance with the Council's specification for engineering works - AUS-SPEC #1. The plan shall be prepared by a qualified civil engineer.

The design must include the following information:

- Provision of any road widening within Moorilla the local road portion of Pittwater Road. adjacent Pittwater Road. Current footpath path widths are to be maintained.
- ii. Provision of 1.5m wide footpath within May Road and *Moorilla* the local road portion of Pittwater Road.
- iii. Provision of a stormwater drainage pit within *Moorilla Pittwater*-Road, to be a minimum 1 metre clear of the driveway.

The fee associated with the assessment and approval of the application is to be in accordance with Council's Fee and Charges. An approval is to be submitted to the Certifying Authority prior to the issue of the Construction Certificate.

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Reason: To ensure engineering works are constructed in accordance with relevant standards and Council's specification.

(Condition modified in LEC Proceedings No. LEC No: 2024/0004463 to reference the correct road)

### 12A Removal of redundant driveways

All redundant driveways shall be removed and reinstated to Council standard kerb and gutter. Suitably prepared plans shall be submitted to for an approval under and approved by Council prior to the issue of the Construction Certificate. All costs associated with the works shall be borne by the applicant.

A plan checking fee (amount to be advised) and lodgement of a performance bond may be required from the applicant prior to the release of the approval.

Reason: To maximise on street car parking by removing driveways that are no longer needed in accordance with Council policy.

(Condition added in LEC Proceedings No. LEC No: 2024/0004463)

12B Pedestrian Site Distance at property boundary

A pedestrian sight triangle of 2.0 metres by 2.5m metres, in accordance with AS2890.1:2004 is to be provided at the vehicular access points to the property and where internal circulation roadways intersect with footpaths or other pedestrian access areas.

Details demonstrating compliance are to be submitted to the Principal Certifier prior to the issue of the Construction Certificate.

Reason: To maintain pedestrian safety.

(Condition added in LEC Proceedings No. LEC No: 2024/0004463)

#### 13. Shoring of Adjoining Property

Should the proposal require shoring to support an adjoining property or Council land, owner's consent for the encroachment onto the affected property owner shall be provided with the engineering drawings.

Council approval is required if temporary ground anchors are to be used within Council land. A Temporary Ground Anchors (Road Reserve) Application is to be submitted with Council for assessment and approval subject to Council's Fees and Charges.

Details demonstrating compliance are to be submitted to the Principal Certifying Authority prior to the issue of the Construction Certificate

Reason: To ensure that owners consent is obtained for ancillary works, and to ensure the protection of adjoining properties and Council land.

### 14. Pump-Out System Design for Stormwater Disposal

The design of the pump-out system for stormwater disposal will be permitted for

drainage of hard surfaces areas such as driveways and basement pavement areas only, and must be designed in accordance with AS/NZS 3500. The Applicant is to provide engineering details demonstrating compliance with this requirement and certified by an appropriately qualified and practising hydraulic engineer. Details demonstrating compliance are to be submitted to the Certifying Authority prior to the issue of the Construction Certificate.

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Reason: To ensure adequate provision is made for the discharge of stormwater from the excavated parts of the site.

#### 15. Compliance with Standards

The development is required to be carried out in accordance with all relevant Australian Standards.

Details demonstrating compliance with the relevant Australian Standard are to be submitted to the Certifying Authority prior to the issue of the Construction Certificate.

Reason: To ensure the development is constructed in accordance with appropriate standards. (DACPLC02)

#### 16. External Finishes to Roof

The external finish to the roof shall have a medium to dark range in order to minimise solar reflections to neighbouring properties. Any roof with a metallic steel finish is not permitted.

Details demonstrating compliance are to be submitted to the Certifying Authority prior to the issue of the Construction Certificate.

Reason: To ensure that excessive glare or reflectivity nuisance does not occur as a result of the development.

#### 17. Off-street Parking Facilities

The driveway/access ramp grades, access and car parking facilities must comply with the Australian/New Zealand Standard AS/NZS 2890.1:2004 - Parking facilities - Offstreet car parking.

Reason: To ensure compliance with Australian Standards relating to manoeuvring, access and parking of vehicles (DACTRCPCC1)

#### 18. Construction Traffic Management Plan.

As a result of site constraints, limited vehicle access and parking, a A Construction Traffic Management Plan (CTMP) and report shall be prepared by an RMS accredited person a Transport for NSW accredited person and submitted to Council via an application for a Permit to Implement Traffic Control. The application form can be accessed via <a href="https://www.northernbeaches.nsw.gov.au/council/forms">https://www.northernbeaches.nsw.gov.au/council/forms</a>. Approval of the permit application by the Northern Beaches Council Traffic Team is required prior to issue of any Construction Certificate.

The CTMP must address following:-

 The proposed phases of construction works on the site, and the expected duration of each construction phase;

- The proposed order in which works on the site will be undertaken, and the method statements on how various stages of construction will be undertaken;
- Make provision for all construction materials to be stored on site, at all times;

- The proposed areas within the site to be used for the storage of excavated materials, construction materials and waste containers during the construction period;
- The proposed method of access to and egress from the site for construction vehicles, including access routes and truck rates through the Council area and the location and type of temporary vehicular crossing for the purpose of minimising traffic congestion and noise in the area, with no access across public parks or reserves being allowed;
- The proposed method of loading and unloading excavation and construction machinery, excavation and building materials, formwork and the erection of any part of the structure within the site. Wherever possible mobile cranes should be located wholly within the site;
- Make provision for parking onsite. All Staff and Contractors are to use the basement parking once available.
- Temporary truck standing/ queuing locations in a public roadway/ domain in the vicinity of the site are not permitted unless approved by Council prior.
- Include a Traffic Control Plan prepared by a person with suitable RMS accreditation for any activities involving the management of vehicle and pedestrian traffic.
- The proposed manner in which adjoining property owners will be kept advised of the timeframes for completion of each phase of development/construction process. It must also specify that a minimum Fourteen (14) days notification must be provided to adjoining property owners prior to the implementation of any temporary traffic control measure.
- Include a site plan showing the location of any site sheds, location of requested Work Zones, anticipated use of cranes and concrete pumps, structures proposed on the footpath areas (hoardings, scaffolding or shoring) and any tree protection zones around Council street trees.
- Take into consideration the combined construction activities of other development in the surrounding area. To this end, the consultant preparing the CTMP must engage and consult with developers undertaking major development works within a 250m radius of the subject site to ensure that appropriate measures are in place to prevent the combined impact of construction activities, such as (but not limited to) concrete pours, crane lifts and dump truck routes. These communications must be documented and submitted to Council prior to work commencing on site.

 The proposed method/device to remove loose material from all vehicles and/or machinery before entering the road reserve, any runoff from the washing down of vehicles shall be directed to the sediment control system within the site;

LEC No: 2024/44633

- Specify that the roadway (including footpath) must be kept in a serviceable condition for the duration of construction. At the direction of Council, undertake remedial treatments such as patching at no cost to Council.
- The proposed method of support to any excavation adjacent to adjoining properties, or the road reserve. The proposed method of support is to be designed and certified by an appropriately qualified and practising Structural Engineer, or equivalent;
- Proposed protection for Council and adjoining properties; and
- The location and operation of any on site crane.

The CTMP shall be prepared in accordance with relevant sections of Australian Standard 1742 – "Manual of Uniform Traffic Control Devices", RMS' Manual – "Traffic Control at Work Sites".

All fees and charges associated with the review of this plan is to be in accordance with Council's Schedule of Fees and Charges and are to be paid at the time that the Construction Traffic Management Plan is submitted.

Reason: To ensure public safety and minimise any impacts to the adjoining pedestrian and vehicular traffic systems. Confirming appropriate measures have been considered for site access, storage and the operation of the site during all phases of the construction process in a manner that respects adjoining owner's property rights and protects amenity in the locality, without unreasonable inconvenience to the community.

Reason: To minimise impact of construction activities on the surrounding community, in terms of vehicle traffic (including traffic flow and parking) and pedestrian amenity adjacent to the site.

#### (Condition modified in LEC Proceedings No. LEC No: 2024/0004463)

#### 19. Waste and Recycling Requirements

Details demonstrating compliance with Warringah Development Control Plan – Part C9 Waste Management, including the required Warringah Waste Management Plan, are to be submitted to and approved by the Certifying Authority prior to the issue of any Construction Certificate.

Note: If the proposal, when compliant with Warringah Development Control Plan – Part C9 Waste Management, causes inconsistencies with other parts of the approval i.e. architectural or landscaped plans a modification(s) to the development may be required.

Reason: To ensure adequate and appropriate waste and recycling facilities are provided. (DACWTC01)

### 19A Stormwater Disposal

The applicant is to submit Stormwater Engineering Plans for the new development within this development consent in accordance with AS/NZS 3500 and Council's Water Management for Development Policy, prepared by an appropriately qualified and practicing Civil or Hydraulic Engineer who has membership to Engineers Australia, National Engineers Register (NER) or Professionals Australia (RPENG), indicating all details relevant to the collection and disposal of stormwater from the site, buildings, paved areas and where appropriate adjacent catchments. Stormwater shall be conveyed from the site to Council's stormwater pipe on Pittwater Road via an on-site detention system.

LEC No: 2024/44633

Details demonstrating compliance are to be submitted to the Certifier for approval prior to the issue of the Construction Certificate.

Reason: To ensure appropriate provision for disposal of stormwater management arising from the development.

(Condition added in LEC Proceedings No. LEC No: 2024/0004463)

19B Geotechnical Report Recommendations have been Incorporated into Designs and Structural Plans

The recommendations identified in the Geotechnical Report referenced in Condition 1 of this consent are to be incorporated into the construction plans. Details demonstrating compliance are to be submitted to the Certifier prior to the issue of the construction certificate.

Reason: To ensure geotechnical risk is mitigated appropriately.

19C Vehicle Crossings Applications

The Applicant is to submit an application with Council for driveway levels to construct one vehicle crossing on the May road frontage of site 6.0 metres wide in accordance with Northern Beaches Council Standard Drawing A4 3330/1 N in accordance with Section 138 of the Roads Act 1993.

The Applicant is to submit an application with Council for driveway levels to construct one vehicle crossing on the Pittwater Road frontage of site a maximum of 7.0 metres wide in accordance with Northern Beaches Council Standard Drawing A4 3330/4 EH in accordance with Section 138 of the Roads Act 1993.

Note - driveways are to be in plain concrete only.

The fee associated with the assessment and approval of the application is to be in accordance with Council's Fee and Charges.

A Council approval is to be submitted to the Certifier prior to the issue of the Construction Certificate.

Reason: To facilitate suitable vehicular access to private property.

19D Off Street Parking Design

The Applicant shall submit a design for the parking facility in accordance with the relevant provisions of Australian/New Zealand Standard AS/NZS 2890.1:2004 parking facilities - Off-street car parking, in particular Section 2.4.5 Physical Controls and Section 2.6 Design of Domestic Driveways.

Details demonstrating compliance are to be submitted to the Principal Certifier

prior to the issue of the Construction Certificate.

Reason: Compliance with this consent.

(Condition added in LEC Proceedings No. LEC No: 2024/0004463)

19E Submission Roads Act Application for Civil Works in the Public Road

The Applicant is to submit an application for approval for infrastructure works on Council's roadway. Engineering plans for the new development works within the road reserve and this development consent are to be submitted to Council for approval under the provisions of Sections 138 and 139 of the Roads Act 1993.

The application is to include Civil Engineering plans for the construction of footpath and private stormwater connection into Council's pipe which are to be generally in accordance with the Council's specification for engineering works - AUS-SPEC #1. The plans shall be prepared by a qualified Civil Engineer. The design must include the following information:

1. The design of a 1.5 metre wide footpath from the frontage of 11 May Road to its intersection with Pittwater Road. The design is to include a longitudinal section and is to be in accordance with Council's Standard Drawings for roads - Drawing No. TCI-Standard\_Drawing-0100-Final8, rev 5 dated 08.12.23.

A copy of the standard drawings is to be requested from Council prior to the commencement of design works.

2. The design of a 1.5 metre wide footpath from the frontage of 613 Pittwater Road to its intersection with May Road. The design is to cater for the complete re-construction of the path to provide a minimum width of 1.5 metres width from the back of kerb. The design is to include a longitudinal section and is to be in accordance with Council's Standard Drawings for roads - Drawing No. TCI-Standard Drawing-0100-Final8, rev 5 dated 08.12.23.

A copy of the standard drawings is to be requested from Council prior to the commencement of design works.

3. The design of a stormwater connection from private property into Council's existing stormwater pipe on the development site frontage. The design is to include an 1.8 metre lintel, a longitudinal section showing all surveyed crossing services (potholed), and is to be in accordance with Council's Standard Drawings for stormwater - \$1001 to \$1020, rev A dated 15.03.21. The lintel shall be located a minimum of 1 metre clear of any existing or proposed vehicle crossings. A copy of the standard drawings is to be requested from Council prior to the commencement of design works.

The fee associated with the assessment and approval of the application is to be in accordance with Council's Fee and Charges

An approval is to be submitted to the Principal Certifier prior to the issue of the

Construction Certificate.

Reason: To ensure engineering works are constructed in accordance with relevant standards and Council's specification.

(Condition added in LEC Proceedings No. LEC No: 2024/0004463)

19F Tanking of Basement Level

The basement area is to be permanently tanked. The Applicant is to submit structural details of the tanking, prepared by a suitably qualified Engineer. Where temporary dewatering works are required on the development site during construction, the developer/applicant must apply for and obtain a bore license from the NSW Office of Environment and Heritage. The bore license must be obtained prior to commencement of dewatering works. All requirements of Water NSW are to be complied with and a copy of the approval must be submitted to the Certifier.

Details demonstrating compliance are to be submitted to the Principal Certifier prior to the issue of the Construction Certificate.

Reason: To prevent ingress of sub-surface flows into the basement area and to comply with State Government Requirements.

(Condition added in LEC Proceedings No. LEC No: 2024/0004463)

19G Shoring of Council's Road Reserve (Temporary road anchors)

Should the proposal require shoring to support an adjoining property or Council land, the Applicant shall provide the adjoining properties with engineering drawings, detailing the proposed shoring works for their consideration and approval. Written approval from Council under Section 138 of the Roads Act 1993 is required if temporary ground anchors are to be used within Council's road reserve. The Owner's approval is to be submitted to the Principal Certifier prior to the issue of the Construction Certificate.

Reason: To ensure that owners consent is obtained for ancillary works, and to ensure the protection of adjoining properties and Council land.

(Condition added in LEC Proceedings No. LEC No: 2024/0004463)

#### 19H Pre-Construction Stormwater Assets Dilapidation Report

The Applicant is to submit a pre-construction / demolition Dilapidation Survey of Council's Stormwater Assets prepared by a suitably qualified person in accordance with Council's Guidelines for Preparing a Dilapidation Survey of Council Stormwater Asset, to record the existing condition of the asset prior to the commencement of works. 19I Pre-Commencement Dilapidation Report

The applicant must prepare and submit a dilapidation report providing an accurate record of the existing condition of adjoining public property and public infrastructure (including roads, gutter, footpaths, etc). A copy of the report must be provided to Council, any other owners of public infrastructure and the owners of adjoining and affected private properties.

The dilapidation report must be submitted to Council for written approval and the written approval is then to be submitted to the Certifier prior to the issue of the any Construction Certificate and the commencement of any works including demolition.

Reason: Protection of Council's infrastructure during construction.

#### CONDITIONS THAT MUST BE ADDRESSED PRIOR TO ANY COMMENCEMENT

### 20. Public Liability Insurance - Works on Public Land

Any person or contractor undertaking works on public land must take out Public Risk Insurance with a minimum cover of \$20 million in relation to the occupation of, and approved works within Council's road reserve or public land, as approved in this consent. The Policy is to note, and provide protection for Northern Beaches Council, as an interested party and a copy of the

Policy must be submitted to Council prior to commencement of the works. The Policy must be valid for the entire period that the works are being undertaken on public land.

Reason: To ensure the community is protected from the cost of any claim for damages arising from works on public land.

#### 20A Work Zones and Permits

Prior to commencement of the associated works, the applicant shall obtain a Work Zone Permit where it is proposed to reserve an area of road pavement for the parking of vehicles associated with a construction site.

A separate application is required with a Traffic Management Plan for

    - All structures are to bridge tree roots greater than 50mm diameter unless directed otherwise by a qualified Arborist on site.
    - iii. All tree protection to be in accordance with AS4970-2009 Protection of trees on development sites, with particular reference to Section 4 Tree Protection Measures.
      - All tree pruning within the subject site is to be in accordance with WDCP2011 Clause E1

Private Property Tree Management and AS 4373 Pruning of amenity trees.

 All tree protection measures, including fencing, are to be in place prior to commencement of works.

Reason: To ensure compliance with the requirement to retain and protect significant planting on the site. (DACLAD01)

#### 22B Utilities Services

Prior to the commencement of demolition works, written evidence of the following service provider requirements must be provided to the Principal Certifier:

- a) a letter from Ausgrid demonstrating that satisfactory arrangements can be made for the installation and supply of electricity,
- b) a response from Sydney Water as to whether the proposed works subject to this consent would affect any Sydney Water infrastructure, and whether further requirements need to be met, and
- c) other relevant utilities or services that the development as proposed to be carried out is satisfactory to those other service providers, or if it is not, the changes that are required to make the development satisfactory to them.

Details demonstrating compliance are to be submitted to the Principal Certifier prior to the commencement of demolition works.

Reason: To ensure relevant utility and service providers' requirements are provided to the Principal Certifier.

with Council's Fee and Charges. An approval is to be submitted to the Certifying Authority prior to the issue of the Construction Certificate.

Reason: To facilitate suitable vehicular access to private property.

#### 25. Road Reserve

The applicant shall ensure the public footways and roadways adjacent to the site are maintained in a safe condition at all times during the course of the work.

Reason: Public Safety.

#### 26. Civil Works Supervision

The Applicant shall ensure all civil works approved in the Section 138 approval are supervised by an appropriately qualified and practising Civil Engineer. Details demonstrating compliance are to be submitted to the Principal Certifying Authority and/or Roads Authority.

Reason: To ensure compliance of civil works with Council's specification for engineering works.

# 27. Compliance with the Boarding House Plan of Management

The requirements of the Boarding House Plan of Management required by this consent is to be fully implemented in perpetuity from the issue of any interim / final occupation certificate.

Reason: To ensure the premises a maintained in an appropriate manner in perpetuity. (DACHPEDW2)

#### 28. Vehicle Crossings

The Applicant is to construct one vehicle crossing in May Road 5.5 metres wide in accordance with Northern Beaches Council Drawing No A4-3330/1 N and one vehicle crossing in *Moorilla-Pittwater* Road 6.5.0 metres wide in accordance with Northern Beaches Council Drawing No A4-3330/3 NL and the driveway levels application approval. An Authorised Vehicle Crossing Contractor shall construct the vehicle crossing and associated works within the road reserve in plain concrete. All redundant laybacks and crossings are to be restored to footpath/grass. Prior to the pouring of concrete, the vehicle crossing is to be inspected by Council and a satisfactory "Vehicle Crossing Inspection" card issued. A copy of the vehicle crossing inspection form is to be submitted to the Principal Certifying Authority.

Reason: To facilitate suitable vehicular access to private property.

(Condition modified in LEC Proceedings No. LEC No: 2024/0004463)

#### 29. Staff and Contractor Parking.

The applicant is to make provision for parking onsite for all construction staff and contractors for the duration of the project. All Staff and Contractors are to use the basement parking once available. All necessary facilities are to be provided to accommodate this requirement including lighting in the basement, security cameras, etc.

Reason: To ensure minimum impact of construction activity on local parking amenity (DACTREDW1)

#### 30. Implementation of Construction Traffic Management Plan.

All works and construction activities are to be undertaken in accordance with the approved Construction Traffic Management Plan (CTMP). All controls in the CTMP must be maintained at all times and all traffic management control must be undertaken by personnel having appropriate RMS accreditation. Should the implementation or effectiveness of the CTMP be impacted by surrounding major development not encompassed in the approved CTMP, the CTMP measures and controls are to be revised accordingly and submitted to Council for approval. A copy of the approved CTMP is to be kept onsite at all times and made available to the accredited certifier or Council on request.

Reason: to ensure compliance of the developer/builder in adhering to the Construction Traffic Management procedures agreed and are held liable to the conditions of consent rather than any secondary approval. (DACTREDW2)

#### 30A Road Reserve

The applicant shall ensure the public footways and roadways adjacent to the site are maintained in a safe condition at all times during the course of the work.

Reason: Public safety.

(Condition added in LEC Proceedings No. LEC No: 2024/0004463)

#### 30B Property Boundary Levels

The Applicant is to maintain the property boundary levels. No approval is granted for any change to existing property alignment levels to accommodate the development.

Details demonstrating compliance are to be submitted to the

Principal Certifier.

Reason: To maintain the existing profile of the nature strip/road

reserve.

(Condition added in LEC Proceedings No. LEC No: 2024/0004463)

#### CONDITIONS WHICH MUST BE COMPLIED WITH PRIOR TO THE ISSUE OF THE OCCUPATION CERTIFICATE

# 31. Post- Construction Stormwater Assets Dilapidation Report (Council stormwater assets)

The Applicant shall submit a post-construction Dilapidation Survey of Council's Stormwater Assets is to be prepared by a suitably qualified person in accordance with Council's Guidelines for Preparing a Dilapidation Survey of Council Stormwater Asset in order to determine if the asset has been damaged by the works. # 32. Positive Covenant and Restriction as to User for On-site Stormwater Detention Structures

The Applicant shall lodge the Legal Documents Authorisation Application with the original completed request forms (NSW Land Registry standard forms 13PC and/or 13RPA) to Council and a copy of the Works-as-Executed plan (details overdrawn on a copy of the approved drainage plan), hydraulic engineers' certification.

The Applicant shall create on the Title a restriction on the use of land and a positive covenant in respect to the ongoing maintenance and restriction of the on-site stormwater detention structures within this development consent. The terms of the positive covenant and restriction are to be prepared to Council's standard requirements at the applicant's expense and endorsed by Northern Beaches Council's delegate prior to lodgement with the NSW Land Registry Services. Northern Beaches Council shall be nominated as the party to release, vary or modify such covenant.

Details demonstrating compliance are to be submitted to the Principal Certifying Authority prior to the issue of final Occupation Certificate.

#### 33. Boarding House Plan of Management

Prior to the issuing of any interim / final occupation certificate, certification is to be provided from the operator that the requirements of the Boarding House Plan of Management have been implemented and are compliant.

#### 39. Fire Safety Matters

Northern Beaches Council's delegate shall sign these documents prior to the submission to the NSW Land Registry Services. A copy of the certificate of title demonstrating the creation of the positive covenant and restriction for on-site storm water detention as to user is to be submitted.

- Public Health Regulation 2012
- Boarding Houses Act 2012

#### 44. Landscape maintenance

- i) Trees shrubs and groundcovers required to be planted under this consent are to be mulched, watered and fertilized as required at the time of planting.
- ii) If any tree, shrub or groundcover required to be planted under this consent fails, they are to be replaced with similar species to maintain the landscape theme and be generally in accordance with the approved Landscape Plan.

#### 45. Occupancy of Boarding House

- 2. Servicing of the site along May Road near the frontage of the site.

This plan is to be submitted to and approved by the Northern Beaches Local Traffic Committee prior to the issue of any Occupation Certificate.

#### 48. Signage and Line Marking - Implementation

All signage and line marking, as per the Signage and Line Marking Plan approved by the LTC, shall be installed by the applicant at no cost to Council, prior to the issue of any Occupation Certificate.

Reason: To ensure all parking controls are in place prior to servicing of the site (DACTRGOG)

#### 49. Car Share

Provision shall be made for one (1) car share space in the carpark upper in the space nominated on Floor Plan B,C prepared by Leech Harmon Architects (Rev J) dated 21 June 2021. Evidence of an agreement with a car share company to provide a car for the space allocated for the car share space is to be submitted to the Council prior to the issue of any occupation certificate.

The car share arrangements are to be operative upon issue of the occupation certificate and are to be maintained for the life of the development.

#### 50. Car Share

#### 51. Residential Parking Permit

Reason: To ensure the tenants are aware that they are not entitled to a permit regardless if they are within a Resident Parking Scheme (RPS).
