When purchasing my unit I was led to believe the only grassed area was for exclusive use of residents. The proposed bowling green is for non resident activities seven days per week from 8:30 am until 5:30 pm. This is totally unacceptable in a seniors environment. Mounties own Manly Bowling Club of which I am a member and which I am very happy to attend and will continue to attend for Bowling. To replace the only grass area available to residents with synthetic turf to me is ridiculous. We do not have enough outdoor space for the 96 units here (approximately 150 residents) which leaves us approximately 1 square metre of space per resident. This is totally unacceptable. I cannot believe a retirement act allows the operator, Mounties, to provide so little space available per resident. In my opinion it shows Mounties has no experience in running a seniors retirement village. This will destroy the fabric of our community which has grown to be a very strong caring group of people caring for each other.
