Asbestos concerns for demolition included in DA 2020/1743 - 45 Lantana Ave, Wheeler Heights 2097

No identifiable Demolition Plan provided - essential as Asbestos is likely to be present. No description of the existing dwelling to be demolished including it's date of build, on any plans. The date is a trigger for Asbestos concerns.

On the Waste Management Plan provided p5 and 7 'No asbestos' has been selected. However the building to be demolished was built around 1990, well within Council's recommended period of prior to 2004, when houses are likely to have significant amounts of asbestos internally and externally, especially in the eaves, internal and external wall cladding, ceilings (particularly in wet areas such as bathrooms and laundries) and fences.

This is highly advisable before undertaking major renovations to buildings constructed or containing materials from prior to 2004'
