We provide the following in response to Council's concerns:

1. Acoustic Dynamics acknowledges that the noise created from the impact between the pickleball and bat is different to the impact between a tennis ball and racket;

- Acoustic Dynamics assessment has been performed using operator-attended measurements taken during various pickleball lessons and matches, not tennis lessons or matches;
- 3. Our measurements and calculations are representative of noise emission resulting from various pickleball matches (not tennis matches) occurring simultaneously;
- 4. Noise emission is predicted to comply with the applicable criterion during the evening assessment period (6pm until 10pm), provided our recommended design and management measures are implemented.

The pickleball board, when hit by the ball, vibrates back and forth creating a louder sound than if it were a tennis ball and racket. The closest residential receiver is within 60 meters of the proposed courts. Environmental Health caution the use of the courts to 9:00pm especially in relation to noise and lighting with residential receivers within 60m across the Mona Vale Road. Operation of the courts Monday to Sunday provides no respite in the evening time period.
