Reasons for referral

This application seeks consent for the following:

- Construction / development works within 5 metres of a tree or
- New residential works with three or more dwellings. (RFB's, townhouses, seniors living, guesthouses, etc). or
- Mixed use developments containing three or more residential dwellings.
- New Dwellings or

Officer comments

The application is assessed by Landscape Referral against Warringah Local Environmental Plan 2011 and the following Warringah Development Control Plan 2011 controls (but not limited to):

- D1 Landscaped Open Space and Bushland Setting
- E1 Preservation of Trees or Bushland Vegetation and E2 Prescribed Vegetation

An updated Arboricultural Impact Assessment (AIA) report is submitted that determines impacts to existing trees, and an updated Landscape Plan is submitted that proposes enhancement to the existing landscape setting.

Upon review of these updated documents, previous comments are not altered by Landscape Referral.

The updated AIA report recommends retention of trees 19 and 65 (Livistona australis); tree 22 (Corymbia maculata); tree 62 (Melaleuca bracteata); and tree 66 (Cyathea cooperi), as requested by Landscape Referral as no impacts are assessed from the proposed development works. The updated AIA however maintains that tree 26 should be removed whilst reporting that there is no proposed works within the tree protection zone and as such this tree 26 (Livistona australis) shall be retained.

Apart from exempt species (trees 24, 27, 29, 31, 33, 38, 39 and 40) nominated in the AIA report for removal that do not require Council consent for management or removal, only one prescribed tree (28 Livistona australis) requires removal.

The Landscape Plan submitted raises no concerns from Landscape Referral.

The proposal is therefore supported.

CONDITIONS TO BE SATISFIED PRIOR TO THE ISSUE OF THE CONSTRUCTION CERTIFICATE

Tree Root Investigation and Tree Root Map

- a) Prior to the issue of a Construction Certificate, a tree root mapping investigation for existing tree 22 (Spotted Gum Corymbia maculata) identified in the Arboricultural Impact Assessment under section 6.2.3 shall be undertaken, and a tree root map shall be documented that will be the basis for determining construction methodology near the existing tree.
- b) An Arborist with minimum AQF Level 5 in arboriculture shall supervise the works to verify tree root locations. A non-destructive root investigation shall be conducted complying with clause 3.3.4 of AS 4970-2009 Protection of Trees on Development Sites.
- c) The root investigation shall map existing roots of significance that must not be impacted by construction works. The tree root investigation shall be conducted to confirm the following data to be used for the location/alignment of any new proposed works including stormwater works:
- i) confirmation of the location of any tree roots at or >25mm (\emptyset) diameter to areas that require excavation for proposed works. Alternative alignment of proposed works shall be provided as necessary to avoid major roots, and
- ii) mapping of the suitable location/alignment of proposed works.
- d) The tree root map shall be issued to the Stormwater Engineer as a basis for stormwater design, and for determining the final location/alignment and construction methodology of proposed works within the tree protection zone (TPZ).
- e) Prior to the issue of a Construction Certificate, the Arborist shall provide certification to the Principal Certifier that the tree root investigation and clear distance recommendations have been adequately addressed in the Construction Certificate plans.

Reason: To ensure protection of vegetation proposed for retention.

CONDITIONS THAT MUST BE ADDRESSED PRIOR TO ANY COMMENCEMENT

Tree Removal Within the Property

This consent approves the removal of prescribed trees on the subject site as identified in the Arboricultural Impact Assessment, approved Plans, or as listed below:

- a) tree 28
- b) a qualified AQF level 5 Arborist shall identify these trees on site and tag or mark prior to removal.

Reason: To enable authorised development works.

CONDITIONS TO BE COMPLIED WITH DURING DEMOLITION AND BUILDING WORK

Tree and Vegetation Protection

- a) Existing trees and vegetation shall be retained and protected, including:
- i) all trees within the site not approved for removal, including trees and vegetation nominated for retention on the approved Plans,
- ii) all trees and vegetation located on adjoining properties,
- iii) all trees and vegetation within the road reserve.
- b) Tree protection shall be undertaken as follows:

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- i) tree protection shall be in accordance with AS4970-2009 Protection of trees on development sites, and any recommendations of an approved Arboricultural Impact Assessment and in particular sections 6.2.1, 6.2.2, 6.2.3, and Appendix 1 and 2,
- ii) existing ground levels shall be maintained within the tree protection zone of trees to be retained, unless authorised by an Arborist/Project Arborist with minimum AQF Level 5 in arboriculture,
- iii) removal of existing tree roots at or >25mm (\emptyset) diameter is not permitted without consultation with an Arborist/Project Arborist with minimum AQF Level 5 in arboriculture,
- iv) no excavated material, building material storage, site facilities, nor landscape materials are to be placed within the canopy dripline of trees and other vegetation required to be retained,
- v) structures are to bridge tree roots at or >25mm (\emptyset) diameter unless directed by an Arborist/Project Arborist with minimum AQF Level 5 in arboriculture on site,
- vi) excavation for stormwater lines and all other utility services is not permitted within the tree protection zone, without consultation with an Arborist/Project Arborist with minimum AQF Level 5 in arboriculture including advice on root protection measures,
- vii) should either or all of v) or vi) occur during site establishment and construction works, an Arborist/Project Arborist with minimum AQF Level 5 in arboriculture shall provide recommendations for tree protection measures. Details including photographic evidence of works undertaken shall be submitted by the Arborist/Project Arborist to the Principal Certifier,
- viii) any temporary access to, or location of scaffolding within the tree protection zone of a protected tree or any other tree to be retained during the construction works is to be undertaken using the protection measures specified in sections 4.5.3 and 4.5.6 of AS4970-2009 Protection of trees on development sites,
- ix) the activities listed in section 4.2 of AS4970-2009 Protection of trees on development sites, shall not occur within the tree protection zone of any tree on the lot or any tree on an adjoining site,
- x) tree pruning from within the site to enable approved works shall not exceed 10% of any tree canopy, and shall be in accordance with AS4373-2007 Pruning of amenity trees,
- xi) the tree protection measures specified in this clause must: i) be in place before work commences on the site, and ii) be maintained in good condition during the construction period, and iii) remain in place for the duration of the construction works.

The Principal Certifier must ensure that:

c) The arboricultural works listed in a) and b) are undertaken as complaint to AS4970-2009 Protection of trees on development sites, and any recommendations of an approved Arboricultural Impact Assessment and/or Project Arborist as applicable.

Reason: Tree and vegetation protection.

CONDITIONS WHICH MUST BE COMPLIED WITH PRIOR TO THE ISSUE OF THE OCCUPATION CERTIFICATE

Landscape Completion

Landscape works are to be implemented in accordance with the approved Landscape Plan, and inclusive of the following conditions:

- a) landscape works are to be contained within the legal property boundaries,
- b) tree, shrub and groundcover planting shall be installed as indicated on the approved Landscape Plan.
- c) all tree planting shall be a minimum pre-ordered planting size of 75 litres or as otherwise scheduled if greater in size; generally selected from Northern Beaches Council's Native Plant Species Guide, or Council's Tree Guide; to achieve at least (insert) metres height at maturity; meet the requirements of Natspec Specifying Trees; planted into a prepared planting hole 1m x 1m x 600mm depth, backfilled with a sandy loam mix or approved similar, mulched to 75mm depth minimum and maintained, and watered until established; and shall be located at least 3.0 metres from buildings or more, at least 1.5

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metres from common boundaries; and located either within garden bed or within a prepared bed within lawn.

- d) where swimming pools are part of the development works, selected planting shall comply with the planting and care requirements of AS1926.1 for a non-climbable zone,
- e) where the property is certified Bush Fire Prone Land, any new planting may be managed in accordance with Planning for Bushfire Protection 2019.

Prior to the issue of an Occupation Certificate, details (from a landscape architect, landscape designer or qualified horticulturalist) shall be submitted to the Principal Certifier, certifying that the landscape works have been completed in accordance with any conditions of consent.

Reason: Environmental amenity.

Condition of Retained Vegetation

Prior to the issue of an Occupation Certificate, a report prepared by an Arborist/Project Arborist with minimum AQF Level 5 in arboriculture shall be submitted to the Principal Certifier, assessing the health and impact on all existing trees required to be retained on the approved Plans or as listed in the Arboricultural Impact Assessment, including the following information:

- a) compliance to any Arborist recommendations for tree protection generally and during excavation works.
- b) extent of damage sustained by vegetation as a result of the construction works,
- c) any subsequent remedial works required to ensure the long term retention of the vegetation.

Reason: Tree and vegetation protection.

ON-GOING CONDITIONS THAT MUST BE COMPLIED WITH AT ALL TIMES

Landscape Maintenance

If any landscape materials/components or planting under this consent fails, they are to be replaced with similar materials/components. Trees, shrubs and groundcovers required to be planted under this consent are to be mulched, watered and fertilised as required at the time of planting. If any tree, shrub or groundcover required to be planted under this consent fails, they are to be replaced with similar species to maintain the landscape theme and be generally in accordance with the approved Landscape Plan and any conditions of consent.

The approved landscape area shall in perpetuity remain as planting under the development consent, and shall not be replaced with any hard paved surfaces or structures.

Reason: To maintain local environmental amenity.

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
