Reasons for referral

This application seeks consent for any application on land or land being adjoining or adjacent to any parks, reserves, beaches, or foreshore

And as such, Council's Parks, Reserves and Foreshores officers are required to consider the likely impacts of the proposal.

Officer comments

The proposed works are taking place on the boundary of private property and Collaroy Beach/Narrabeen Beach Reserve. Noting that the nature of the works will require use of the reserve as a working area, Parks supports the proposal subject to conditions.

The proposal is therefore supported.

Parks, Reserves and Foreshores Conditions:

CONDITIONS TO BE SATISFIED PRIOR TO THE ISSUE OF THE CONSTRUCTION CERTIFICATE

Installation and Maintenance of Sediment and Erosion Control

Prior to commencement of works on site, sediment and erosion controls must be installed along the immediate downslope of the works area, in accordance with Landcom's 'Managing Urban Stormwater: Soils and Construction' (2004). The erosion controls shall be maintained in an operational condition until the development activities have been completed and the site fully stabilised. Sediment shall be removed from the sediment controls following each heavy or prolonged rainfall period.

Techniques used for erosion and sediment control on site are to be adequately maintained and monitored at all times, particularly after periods of rain, and shall remain in proper operation until all development activities have been completed and the site is sufficiently stabilised with vegetation.

Reason: To protect the surrounding environment from the effects of sedimentation and erosion from the site.

Dilapidation Report of Public Open Space

Submit a dilapidation report including photographic record of the Public Open Space adjoining the development, detailing the physical condition of items such as, but not exclusively to, trees, bushland, rock outcrops and physical improvements such as paths, furniture and play equipment.

The applicant may be held liable to any damage to public infrastructures in the vicinity of the site, where such damage is not accurately recorded under the requirements of this condition prior to the commencement of works. In this regard, the damage deposit lodged by the applicant may be used by Council to repair such damage on Council's property.

Reason: Protection of Council property.

Working on and Access to Reserves Permit

Works (undertaken by principal contractors working without Council supervision) on and access across land under Council's care control and management require a "Working on Reserves" permit prior to commencement. Applications can be obtained from Council's website or the Parks, Reserves and Foreshores business unit.

Reason: Public safety and the protection of Council infrastructure.

CONDITIONS THAT MUST BE ADDRESSED PRIOR TO ANY COMMENCEMENT

Property/Reserve Boundary

Prior to commencement of work, the property/reserve boundary is to be surveyed by a registered surveyor and such boundary is to be clearly marked on site.

Reason: To ensure construction is undertaken within private property.

Construction Management Plan

- a) Prior to commencement of works on site, appropriate environmental site management measures must be in place and incorporate the following throughout demolition and construction:
- i) access to and from the site during construction and demolition,
- ii) safety and security of the site, including details of proposed fencing, hoarding and lighting,
- iii) methods of loading and unloading machinery and building materials,
- iv) location of storage materials, excavation and waste materials,
- v) methods to prevent material being tracked off the site onto surrounding public reserve and roadways,
- vi) erosion, sediment and dust control measures, and
- vii) protection of existing trees and vegetation including the tree protection zone, in accordance with AS 4970-2009 Protection of Trees on Development Sites.

b) During works, the site management measures set out in the above must remain in place and be maintained until the completion of works.

Construction materials must not be stored in Council's Road Reserve or Council owned/managed Land. Safe pedestrian access free of trip hazards must be maintained at all times on or adjacent to any public access routes connected to Council's Road Reserve or Council owned/managed Land.

Reason: To protect the surrounding environment and ensure public safety...

CONDITIONS TO BE COMPLIED WITH DURING DEMOLITION AND BUILDING WORK

Storage of Materials on Council Land Prohibited

The dumping or storage of building materials, spoil, vegetation, green waste, or any other material in the Council reserve is prohibited.

Reason: Public safety and the protection of the environment.

Protection of Council's Public Assets

Any damage to Council's public assets shall be made good by the applicant and/or the contractor, to the satisfaction of Council.

Council's public assets include, but is not limited to the following: road, kerb and gutters, crossovers, crossings, paths, grass verge, open space and associated elements such as furniture, recreational facilities and the like, within the meaning of the Local Government Act 1993.

Reason: To protect and/or restore any damaged public asset.

CONDITIONS WHICH MUST BE COMPLIED WITH PRIOR TO THE ISSUE OF THE OCCUPATION CERTIFICATE

Removal of All Temporary Structures/Materials and Construction Rubbish

Once construction has been completed all silt and sediment fences, silt, rubbish, building debris, straw bales and temporary fences/bunds are to be removed from the site.

Details demonstrating compliance are to be submitted to the Certifying Authority prior to the issue of any Occupation Certificate.

Reason: To protect reserve amenity and public safety.
