I strongly support this Development Application on health, safety and welfare grounds. There is virtually no reception for mobile phones in the majority of the Dardanelles. To make or receive calls Residents, in the majority of cases, have to go outside their unit. This poses serious problems for people who are less physically mobile and residents should not have to do this in the dark or wet weather. These comments also apply to other sections of the Anzac Village such as Beersheba and parts of Cutler Village.

In today's highly technical age, the use of electronic devices is part of everyday life. Electronic medical devices are in quite common use. There are a number of Residents in the Dardanelles who rely on pacemakers to keep their heart working properly. Reception and transmission of the necessary signals is so poor and intermittent that they often receive calls to ensure that the person with the pacemaker is alright because no transmission has been received for a period of time.

Mobile devices are, in an increasing number of homes, the standard and only means of social communication. The lack of reception in many of our areas render this virtually impossible.
