Whilst I suspect a few of the submissions supporting the markets as being legit, I appreciate people would like a market to go too. I also support the local sporting community and the bowling club.

However, OUR STREETS ARE ALREADY CONGESTED.

For those who feel our concerns are not real then I invite them to visit the street any weekend during sport. It can be impossible to get out of your driveway with cars parked (often partly across your driveway) on both sides and directly opposite. People in Bennett St are constantly faced with the task of maneuvering out of their driveways. And in some cases, forced back in by oncoming traffic with nowhere to go. I wish to plea with common sense when reviewing this proposal. Why add chaos to chaos when the capacity of parking has already been reached.

I have attended the Frenches Forrest markets on a regular basis and had to park streets away. However, most people do not want to have to carry their purchases for long distances which I feel will be the case at the Bowling Club.

Should this DA be approved I would hope you will accept that the increase in people rushing to get to the game on time will also increase. Safety of families attending the sports grounds will be need to be considered.

I would also ask that you consider that the bowling club is surrounded by a community who will have the carnival atmosphere imposed on them along with the traffic hazards.

Please find a suitable place where the market goes can attend. Maybe Allambie, Fairlight, Monavale, Cromer or Freshwater where people appear keen for it.
