Development Applications DA 2021/1912 and DA 2021/1914: 2-4 Lakeside Crescent, 8 Palm Avenue and 389 Pittwater Road, North Manly

As you know, Landcom purchased the previous Queenscliff Community Health Centre from NSW Health for the purpose of delivering a project that sought to address housing need in the local area.

The Queenscliff Community Health Centre was completed in 1971 and has contributed to the local character and streetscape for the last 50 years. The proposed adaptive re-use of the Centre respects the original 1970's architecture and design elements, whilst producing a reimagined contribution of new housing and purpose back to the community.

Landcom and its partner Link Wentworth Housing, are pleased to be part of a project that provides a diversity of housing types and affordability options, including homes for older people looking to downsize and housing for those who may not earn sufficient income to afford housing in the Northern Beaches otherwise. These objectives align with Council's objectives for housing as summarised in the table below:

These clarifications and updated plans have had regard to the comments made by the Northern Beaches Council's Design and Sustainability Advisory Panel and Council officers.
