HERITAGE COMMENTS

Discussion of reason for referral

This application has been referred as it is within the vicinity of listed heritage items, being:

Item 159 - Dental Surgery - 45 Grace Avenue, Frenchs Forest; and

Item I58 - Former Methodist Church - 21A Forest Way (corner with Naree Road)

which are both listed in Schedule 5 of Warringah Local Environmental Plan 2011.

Details of heritage items affected

Details of the heritage items in the vicinity, as included in the Warringah Heritage Inventory are:

Item 159 - Dental Surgery - 45 Grace Avenue, Frenchs Forest

Statement of Significance

An excellent representative example of the inter-war functionalist style, designed to exploit its prominent corner location. Displays high integrity with substantial original fabric (including fence). Historically, one of the earliest houses in the area.

Physical Description

Substantial single storey dwelling designed to address corner. Rendered masonry walls with high parapet. Symmetrical design with angled curved bays and projecting entry bay centrally located. Strong string courses above & below metal windows. Original fence.

Item I58 - Former Methodist Church - 21A Forest Way (corner with Naree Road)

Statement of Significance

Built in 1918, the former Methodist church is of historical significance as one of the first churches built in Frenchs Forest. It is however, only moderately intact.

Physical Description

Modest brick church of simple design with steep pitched metal gabled roof. Additions to rear of building. Original facade was replaced with a matching brick wall in the 1950's when the building was shortened.

Consideration of Application

This application is for substantial alterations and additions to the existing Forest Way shopping centre.

The heritage item at 45 Grace Avenue is close to the proposed development, being located on the opposite corner of Russell and Grace Avenues. The proposal involves demolishing the existing buildings on this corner and constructing a new 2 storey building above car parking, as part of an extension and revitalisation of the existing shopping centre. The proposal will increase the scale of development on the opposite side of Russell Avenue, but will not materially affect the heritage item, nor interfere with any views of the heritage item from the public domain. This heritage item is located on a prominent corner, set back and designed to address this corner site. However, it is considered that the proposal will not impact upon the setting of this heritage item, nor its visibility from the public domain. The heritage item will actually gain greater visibility from the proposed new development, given the design which features glazing on the Russell Ave facade.

Therefore it is considered that the proposal will not have an adverse impact upon the heritage significance of the heritage item at 45 Grace Ave.

The other heritage item in the vicinity is the former Methodist church on Forest Way (cnr Naree Road). This item is located 80 metres away from the development site and on the opposite site of Forest Way. Because of this separation, there will be no material or visual impact on this heritage item as a result of this proposal.

In conclusion, no objections are raised on heritage grounds and no conditions are required.
