**Development Application No. DA2021/0669**

**Description: Demolition works and construction of a new restaurant, carparking and associated uses, including a Voluntary Planning Agreement**

**Address: 1191 Barrenjoey Road PALM BEACH**

Reference is made to the proposed development at the above area and Aboriginal heritage.

No sites are recorded in the current development area and the area has been subject to previous disturbance reducing the likelihood of surviving unrecorded Aboriginal sites.

Under the *National Parks and Wildlife Act 1974* (NPW Act) all Aboriginal objects are protected. Should anything thought to be Aboriginal Cultural Heritage items be uncovered during earthworks, works should cease in the area and the Aboriginal Heritage Office be contacted. In line with our normal advice for sandy areas, the Aboriginal Heritage Office recommends that the development conditions should provide for stop work provisions (unexpected discovery protocol) in the unlikely event that human remains are uncovered. Should human remains be uncovered, works must cease and the NSW Police must be contacted.

Should any Aboriginal sites be uncovered during earthworks, works should cease and Council, NSW Heritage, and the Metropolitan Local Aboriginal Land Council (MLALC) should be contacted.
