OBJECTION TO DA2019/1111 - 135 SEAFORTH CRESCENT, SEAFORTH

On behalf of the owner of 141A and 141 Seaforth Crescent, Seaforth, and further to our letter dated 4 November and 28 November 2019.

The applicant hasn't provided any detail in regards to the environmental impact of his proposed development, we think that it's appropriate for us to expand on the final paragraph of our previously filed objection, dated 4 November, in which we referenced the general issue of impact on watershed, flora and fauna, but didn't go into further detail, beyond noting that part of the development would involve the removal of 5 trees. In addition to that, this development would be located in an area that is one of the most diverse "greenbelts" in Sydney, with a multitude of flora and fauna.

The owner of No. 141A and 141 can personally attest to the wide range of native fauna such as, wallabies, a multitude of possums (including ringtails), brush turkeys, echidnas, water dragons and birds (including kookaburras, magpies, currawongs, sulphur crested cockatoos, rainbow lorikeets, cormorants, owls, etc.).

This site is not a normal highly developed suburb. Instead, it is a sensitive steeply sloped "natural" area, in which the massive, highly elevated structure proposed in this DA is wholly inappropriate.

Thus further to our previous submissions we would stress once again the importance of requiring the applicant to erect a full set of height poles, in order to clearly demonstrate the potential extent of proposal. Furthermore, biodiversity and ecological report should be required to investigate the impact of the proposal.
