

# **Environmental Health Referral Response - contaminated lands**

### Reasons for referral

This application requires detailed consideration of Phase 1 and 2 contaminated land matters And as such, Council's Environmental Investigations officers are required to consider the likely impacts.

#### Officer comments General Comments

A preliminary review of the information submitted with the application notes that the Preliminary Site Investigation Report, dated 2 May 2024 prepared by Douglas Partners recommends the following:

• A detailed site investigation (DSI) be carried out and should include both asbestos assessment and ground water investigation. The investigation should include an intrusive acid sulfate soil assessment and supplementary waste classification. as well as delineation testing of the identified asbestos impacts at BH04, TP07 and TP15 and TPH impacts TP09 and TP10, and soil stockpile testing to determine their suitability to be reused on site or otherwise disposed off-site; and

• Preparation of a **remediation action plan (RAP)** to address the identified TPH and asbestos contamination and any additional contamination identified during the above additional investigations.

In accordance with Chapter 4, Clause 4.6 (2) and (3) of State Environmental Planning Policy (Resilience and Hazards) 2021 the finding of the PSI must be considered by the consent authority before determining the application and the applicant is required to carry out, and provide a report, on the detailed investigation if the PSI warrant such an investigation.

(2) Before determining an application for consent to carry out development that would involve a change of use on any of the land specified in subsection (4), the consent authority must consider a report specifying the findings of a preliminary investigation of the land concerned carried out in accordance with the contaminated land planning guidelines.

(3) The applicant for development consent must carry out the investigation required by subsection (2) and must provide a report on it to the consent authority. The consent authority may require the applicant to carry out, and provide a report on, a detailed investigation (as



referred to in the contaminated land planning guidelines) if it considers that the findings of the preliminary investigation warrant such an investigation.

Please therefore submit the DSI and any other additional information to address the recommendation of the PSI within 21 days of the date of this letter

## Recommendation

REFUSAL
