Reference is made to your recent enquiry, dated 4 May 2020, regarding the abovementioned development.

Transport for NSW (TfNSW) has reviewed the submitted information and plans and provides the following comments for your consideration:

1. The subject property is partly affected by a County Road Reservation as shown on the Council's Planning Scheme Maps and by the broken green boundary line on the attached Aerial.

However in principle, TfNSW would raise no objections on Property grounds to the submitted application provided any new building or structures, together with any improvements integral to the future use of the sites, are erected clear of the County Road Reservation and Barrenjoey Road boundary (unlimited in height or depth).

- 2. The design plan should be submitted to Council for referral to TfNSW review.
- Detailed design plans and hydraulic calculations of any changes to the stormwater drainage system are to be submitted to TfNSW for approval, prior to the commencement of any works. Documents should be submitted to <u>Development.Sydney@rms.nsw.gov.au</u>
