

## WASTE MANAGEMENT PLAN

This site waste management plan is prepared by Bourne Blue Architecture for the proposed pool at the rear of an existing dwelling at 20 Narrabeen Park Parade, Warriewood.

### Construction Waste Management

The proposed work involves no demolition work as the pool is positioned in the rear yard. There is adequate space in the driveway at the front of the property for placement of waste containers and waste materials generated from demolition and construction works will be sorted for recycling and disposal. Materials that cannot be recycled will be disposed of by a licensed waste disposal contractor.

The table below identifies the major waste materials expected from the works and their recyclability potential.
