I reside in The Kiln #42 - Owner Occupier

I own and operate a business that deals with birth traumas, maternal anxiety and post natal depression within the postpartum realm of families. These past two years have been the worst I have ever had to deal with and care for.

I am entering this submission as a vote against these plans due to the following reasons - my business has been deeply impacted as I rush to birth traumas. I have been late time and time again and have compromised the well being, care and mental health of many families due to the current situation around St Augustines. Rushing to the Northern Beaches Hospital has also been impacted.

Federal Pde is a joke - parents double parking, parents dropping off kids with nose in first and rear end blocking Federal Pde traffic flow through. There are a ridiculous amount of caravans, cruisers and boats parked along this road too. Students park everywhere even our visitor parking bays before you enter The Kiln. There is construction at Brookie Oval too.

I've tried to get out via Consul Rd but parents and students queue along Consul and around into Gulliver to enter the schools parking lot. Gulliver St is impossible to negotiate getting out to these birth traumas.

If you reach Alfred, after negotiating the chaos on Federal Pde in the morning and afternoon, parents and scholars just randomly stop along Alfred dropping off kids. There is absolutely no systematic, safe and ease of traffic movement for a drop off and pick up zone for this school. I have also spoken to our local MP and I have addressed this issue with the Department of Health due to the nature of my work.

This submission is with deep opposition against further development plans for St Augustines and increasing the school from 1200 to 1600 students is absolutely unacceptable. My business has been impacted and I cannot reach families in time during the most vulnerable stage of their lives.

I look forward to this issue being addressed with the utmost care and understanding
