Residents use this space on a daily basis to relax in the sun, walk, read a book, and to interact with other residents. Taking the residents 'backyard' away will leave them with two tables and a few benches in the gravel area as the only common/recreation area for the 96 apartments - approximately 150 people.

The residents of Watermark purchased these apartments to enjoy their retirement, instead, them and their families are now left worrying about their safety, lack of privacy and additional noise. There will be no control of non-residents (intoxicated or not) passing through the complex. Majority of the apartments will face the proposed bowling green, from the green bowlers will look directly into the residents living spaces.
