Reasons for referral

This application seeks consent for the following:

- Construction / development works within 5 metres of a tree or
- New residential works with three or more dwellings. (RFB's, townhouses, seniors living, guesthouses, etc). or
- Mixed use developments containing three or more residential dwellings.
- New Dwellings or

Officer comments

The Arborist's Report submitted with the application is noted.

The Report indicates that the works can be undertaken without removal of trees on the site

Whilst technically this is agreed with, it is noted that the proposed building extension will locate the approved building within 2 metres of the tree, enabling an exemption from requiring Council approval for removal under Pittwater DCP CI B4.22 Preservation of Trees and Bushland Vegetation.

However, it is noted that the intent is to keep the tree and that the building has been designed to accommodate retention of the tree.

Therefore, based on the assessment of the information provided, the tree can be retained subject to Arboricultural supervision during works.

Council's Landscape section has assessed the proposal against the following Pittwater 21 DCP 2014 Controls:

B4.22 Preservation of Trees and Bushland Vegetation

C1.1 Landscaping

No objections are raised to approval subject to conditions as recommended.

The proposal is therefore supported.

CONDITIONS THAT MUST BE ADDRESSED PRIOR TO ANY COMMENCEMENT

Tree Protection

- A) Existing trees and vegetation shall be retained as follows:
 - i) all trees and vegetation within the site, nominated on the plans and as recommended in the Arboricultural Impact Assessment & Tree Protection Plan prepared by Complete Arborcare dated 28 November, 2019, shall be protected during all construction stages, excluding exempt trees under the relevant planning instruments or legislation,

ii) all other trees and vegetation located on adjoining properties,

iii) all road reserve trees and vegetation.

B) Tree protection shall be undertaken as follows:

i) all tree protection shall be in accordance with AS4970- 2009 Protection of Trees on Development Sites, with particular reference to Section 4, and according to the Arboricultural Impact Assessment prepared by Complete Arborcare dated 28 November, 2019,

ii) any tree roots exposed during excavation with a diameter greater than 25mm within the TPZ must be assessed by an Arborist. Details including photographic evidence of works undertaken shall be submitted by an AQF Level 5 Arborist to the Certifying Authority,

iii) to minimise the impact on trees and vegetation to be retained and protected, no excavated material, building material storage, site facilities, nor landscape materials are to be placed within the canopy dripline of trees and other vegetation required to be retained,

iv) no tree roots greater than 25mm diameter are to be cut from protected trees unless authorized by the Project Arborist on site,

v) all structures are to bridge tree roots greater than 25mm diameter unless directed by a AQF Level 5 Arborist on site,

vi) should either or both iv) and v) occur during site establishment and construction works, a AQF Level 5 Arborist shall provide recommendations for tree protection measures provided. Details including photographic evidence of works undertaken shall be submitted by the Arborist to the Certifying Authority.

Reason: To ensure compliance with the requirement to retain and protect significant planting on development sites, and protect the existing amenity that trees and/or bushland vegetation provide.

Project Arborist

i) A Project Arborist with minimum qualification AQF Level 5 is to be appointed prior to commencement of works.

ii) The Project Arborist is to oversee all tree protection measures, removals and works adjacent to protected trees as outlined in the Arboricultural Impact Assessment prepared by Complete Arborcare dated 28 November, 2019 and AS4970-2009 Protection of trees on development sites.

iii) The Project Arborist is to ensure compliance as relevant with any other environmental requirements conditioned under this consent.

Reason: to ensure protection of vegetation proposed for retention on the site.

CONDITIONS WHICH MUST BE COMPLIED WITH PRIOR TO THE ISSUE OF THE OCCUPATION CERTIFICATE

Condition of retained vegetation

Prior to the issue of an Occupation Certificate, a report prepared by the Pro0ject Arborist shall be submitted to the Certifying Authority, assessing the health and impact of trees and vegetation required



to be retained as a result of the proposed development, including the following information:

- a) Compliance to Arborist recommendations for tree protection and excavation works.
- b) Extent of damage sustained by vegetation as a result of the construction works.
- c) Any subsequent remedial works required to ensure the long term retention of the vegetation.

Reason: To ensure compliance with the requirement to retain and protect significant planting on development sites.
