I refer to your letter dated 7 January 2015 seeking general terms of approval for the above Integrated Development in accordance with Section 91 of the 'Environmental Planning and Assessment Act 1979'.

This response is to be deemed a bush fire safety authority as required under section 100B of the 'Rural Fires Act 1997' and is issued subject to the following numbered conditions:

1. There is no objection to the proposed modifications subject to compliance with the our previous Bush Fire Safety Authority dated 8 September 2010, except where modified below.

Asset Protection Zones

The intent of measures is to provide sufficient space and maintain reduced fuel loads so as to ensure radiant heat levels of buildings are below critical limits and to prevent direct flame contact with a building. To achieve this, the following conditions shall apply:

2. At the commencement of building works and in perpetuity, a 25 metre minimum asset protection zone shall be provided to the northeast and east of Unit Blocks D and E, and shall be managed as an inner protection area (IPA) as outlined within Appendices 2 & 5 of 'Planning for Bush Fire Protection 2006' and the NSW Rural Fire Service's document 'Standards for asset protection zones'.

Design and Construction

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The intent of measures is that buildings are designed and constructed to withstand the potential impacts of bush fire attack. To achieve this, the following conditions shall apply:

- 3. The northeastern and southeastern elevations of Unit Blocks D and E, and including the entire roof, shall comply with Sections 3 and 7 (BAL 29)

 Australian Standard AS3959-2009 'Construction of buildings in bush fire-prone areas'.
 - The southwestern and northwestern elevations shall comply with Sections 3 and 6 (BAL 19) Australian Standard AS3959-2009 'Construction of buildings in bush fire-prone areas' and section A3.7 Addendum Appendix 3 of 'Planning for Bush Fire Protection 2006'.
- 4. Unit Block F shall comply with Sections 3 and 5 (BAL 12.5) Australian Standard AS3959-2009 'Construction of buildings in bush fire-prone areas' and section A3.7 Addendum Appendix 3 of 'Planning for Bush Fire Protection 2006'.
