of the development approval which retained a portion of this wall.

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## Comment:

The proposal was referred to Ausgrid who raised no objections, subject to conditions which have been included in the recommendation of this report.

## **D1 Landscaped Open Space and Bushland Setting**

The approved landscaped open space area is 31.6% (294.7m<sup>2</sup>) resulting in a variation of 8.4% (78.3m<sup>2</sup>).

The proposed development will not result in any changes to the existing landscaped open space area, therefore a detailed merit assessment is not required, in this instance.
