#### Reasons for referral

This application seeks consent for the following:

- Construction / development works within 5 metres of a tree or
- New residential works with three or more dwellings. (RFB's, townhouses, seniors living, guesthouses, etc). or
- Mixed use developments containing three or more residential dwellings.
- New Dwellings or

#### Officer comments

The Landscape Plan and Arborist's Report submitted with the application are noted.

The Arborist's Report indicates removal of 6 trees from the site, 2 of which are listed as High retention value. Of these only 1, *Livistona australis* (T12) is a local native species. The tree is located in the vicinity of the proposed Dining room, which is somewhat dictated to by the proximity of the existing pool, which is to be retained. The plans indicate replanting of *Livistona* to replace the removed palm. One other local native tree, *Eucalyptus robusta*, T25 is indicated for removal to accommodate the new dwelling. The tree has been given a Low retention value rating due to structural issues noted in the report. The Landscape Plan indicates replanting of 2 *E. robusta*.

7 small trees in the Ruskin Rowe road reserve are indicated for removal to accommodate the proposed driveway crossover. The trees have all been given a Low significance ranking and removal is not objected to in this instance, subject to conditions.

The Landscape Plan provided indicates extensive re-landscaping of the site with additional planting, including replanting of 14 canopy trees.

In view of the above, no objections are raised, subject to conditions as indicated below.

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# CONDITIONS TO BE SATISFIED PRIOR TO THE ISSUE OF THE CONSTRUCTION CERTIFICATE

#### **Tree Protection Plan**

In order to protect and enhance onsite vegetation and trees the following applies to the development site:

- (a) A Tree Protection Plan prepared by a AQF Level 5 Arborist (or equivalent) showing the following:
  - Layout of the approved development
  - Location of trees identified for retention
  - Extent of canopy spread
  - Location of tree protection fencing / barriers (in accordance with AS4970 2009)
  - General tree protection measures and hold points for Project Arborist inspections.
- (b) The Tree Protection Plan is to be submitted to the Principal Certifying Authority for approval prior to issue of a Construction Certificate.
- (c) Tree protection measures identified on the plan are to be in place prior to commencement of works.

Reason: To ensure compliance with the requirement to retain and protect significant planting on the site.

## CONDITIONS THAT MUST BE ADDRESSED PRIOR TO ANY COMMENCEMENT

## Tree trunk, root and branch protection

- (a)Existing trees which must be retained
- i) All trees not indicated for removal in the Arboricultural Impact Assessment dated 17 July 2019 prepared by Selena Hannan, unless exempt under relevant planning instruments or legislation
  - ii) Trees located on adjoining private land
- (b) Tree protection
  - i) No tree roots greater than 25mm diameter are to be cut from protected trees unless authorised by the Project Arborist on site.
  - ii) All structures are to bridge tree roots greater than 25mm diameter unless directed otherwise by the Project Arborist on site.
  - iii) All tree protection to be in accordance with the approved Tree Protection Plan, the Arboricultural Impact Assessment dated 17 July 2019 prepared by Selena Hannan, AS4970-2009 Protection of trees on development sites, with particular reference to Section 4 Tree Protection Measures.
  - iv) All tree pruning within the subject site is to be in accordance with relevant local planning controls and AS 4373 Pruning of amenity trees
  - v) All tree protection measures, including fencing, are to be in place prior to commencement of works.

Reason: To ensure compliance with the requirement to retain and protect significant planting on the site.

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## **Project Arborist**

- i) A Project Arborist with minimum qualification AQF Level 5 is to be appointed prior to commencement of works.
- ii) The Project Arborist is to oversee all tree protection measures, removals and works adjacent to protected trees as outlined in the approved Tree Protection Plan, the Arboricultural Impact Assessment dated 17 July 2019 prepared by Selena Hannan and AS4970-2009 Protection of trees on development sites
- iii) The Project Arborist is to ensure compliance as relevant with any other environmental requirements conditioned under this consent.

Reason: to ensure protection of vegetation proposed for retention on the site.

### Tree removal within the road reserve

- i) Removal of approved tree/s in the road reserve shall only be undertaken by a Council approved tree contractor.
- ii)Details of currently approved tree contractors can be obtained from Northern Beaches Council Public Trees Section prior to removal.

Reason: Public liability

## CONDITIONS TO BE COMPLIED WITH DURING DEMOLITION AND BUILDING WORK

## Protection of rock and sites of significance

- a) All rock outcrops outside of the area of approved works are to be preserved and protected at all times during demolition excavation and construction works.
- b) Should any Aboriginal sites be uncovered during the carrying out of works, those works are to cease and Council, the NSW Office of Environment and Heritage (OEH) and the Metropolitan Local Aboriginal Land Council are to be contacted.

Reason: Preservation of significant environmental features.

# CONDITIONS WHICH MUST BE COMPLIED WITH PRIOR TO THE ISSUE OF THE OCCUPATION CERTIFICATE

## Landscape completion certification

- a) Prior to the issue of an Occupation Certificate, a landscape report prepared by a landscape architect or landscape designer shall be submitted to the Certifying Authority, certifying that the landscape works have been completed in accordance with the approved landscape plan and inclusive of any conditions of consent.
- b) Prior to the issue of an Occupation Certificate, a landscape report prepared by a landscape architect or landscape designer shall be submitted to the Certifying Authority, certifying that the landscape works have been established and maintained in accordance with the approved landscape plan.

Reason: To ensure that the landscape treatments are installed to provide landscape amenity.

### **Condition of retained vegetation**

Prior to the issue of an Occupation Certificate, a report prepared by the Project Arborist shall be submitted to the Principal Certifying Authority, assessing the health and impact of trees and vegetation required to be retained as a result of the proposed development, including the following information:

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- a) Compliance to Arborist recommendations for tree protection and excavation works.
- b) Extent of damage sustained by vegetation as a result of the construction works.
- c) Any subsequent remedial works required to ensure the long term retention of the vegetation.

Reason: To ensure compliance with the requirement to retain and protect significant planting on development sites.

Trees shall be planted in accordance with the following schedule:

Details demonstrating compliance are to be submitted to the Principal Certifying Authority prior to the issue of any interim / final Occupation Certificate.

Reason: To maintain environmental amenity.

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
