I hope council will respect the traditional owners and the current residents in the consideration of this development. And in doing so respect the MLEP2013 plan and acknowledge the work, effort, value and guidance that went into establishing this plan.

The application I believe at this stage does not adhere to these values and looks to exceed, I hope Council can adhere to represent our community wishes on maintaining our standards.

It's hard to put the concerns in order as they all hold valid weight. Primarily are we upholding the plan, or is the proposal oversize in terms of building height - then it should be rejected to comply. Will the floor space be larger than permitted - then it should be rejected to comply. Are the number of dwellings and the number of stories (including potentially damaging excavation underground) permitted - again, reject and ensure it complies. It bears no weight for this location to be proposed as a solution to housing density.

Here's a a question - are we respecting the traditional owners in the size and scale of the proposal which does not adhere to our plans, removing the trees (and our heritage Norfolk Pines???), the greenery, taking the landscape from many to give to few?

Our foreshore must be preserved as we share it with the world.
