

## **B. Significance**

#### 5. Why is it important in NSW?



## Statement of state significance:

- This group of Norfolk Island Pines appears on Lands Department SIX Aerial Survey taken in 1943, well established even then (see Image 9). Of the seven pines seen in the photo, six have survived to the present day, and are now magnificent specimens, continuing to provide shade and shelter in a pivotal foreshore location.
- Adjacent to the pines in the 1943 aerial photo is seen what was then a corner shop and residence, its art deco façade still unaltered.
   A photo, probably taken in 1941/42 (see Image 8 Arch and Norma McKinnon's store) shows two of the pines in planter boxes to the right of the Mckinnons store.
- The history of the pines and this shop and residence, now a restaurant at 1 Narrabeen Park Parade, begins with a Crown Grant to Elizabeth Jenkins in 1831 (ref. 1). In 1885 she gifted 12 hectares to the Salvation Army, which now forms much of the Lakeside Caravan Park, as well as the properties on the east side of the first section of Narrabeen Park Parade.(ref. 2).
- The land at No.1 was first sold by the Salvation Army in May 1940, then onsold to Richard Herbert Eslick in October 1940 (ref 3). In that month Warringah Council minutes record a letter from A.W.Mckinnon "that a shop and dwelling is to be erected for him on Narrabeen Park Parade .... requesting council to go into the matter of improving the pathway leading the the Narrabeen rockbaths, which runs past the southern boundary of the site", offering "soil and turf" from the site "to assist in filling and levelling the adjacent parking area; also requesting that the footpath in front of the proposed shop be improved." (ref 4).

A.W. Mckinnon wrote to the council again on 11/8/1941, the minutes of 19/08/1941 recording "requesting permission to plant half a dozen ornamental trees on the southern side of his shop premises facing the lake...also requesting advice as to the most suitable type of tree, and ... assistance in regard to the erection of some means of protection for them". Resolved: that the Works Committee inspect and report (ref.5). Their recommendations were approved at the next meeting.

The last council minutes reference to the Mckinnons is a letter from N.K. (presumably Norma) Mckinnon on 16/10/1943 and16/11/1943 regarding sand buildup pushing the fence at Narrabeen Park Parade out of alignment. Resolved: that the Engineer attend "when horse and scoop is working" (ref 6).

- These Norfolk pines, planted in 1941/42 have historical links with early settlement and as local cultural plantings, Norfolk pines being first described by Capt. James Cook in 1774 (ref 7).

They are in a unique historical area facing the Narrabeen Lagoon entrance, the largest of the coastal lakes in the Sydney area, and the pathway through this shaded grove leads to the heritage listed North Narrabeen Rock Pool, built as part of Unemployment Relief Scheme in the 1930's.

These trees are opposite the historic Lakeside Caravan Park and camping area, also seen in the SIX photo (Image 9), now home to the Coastal Environment Centre, an important cultural and educational resource, from which groups of children go down to the Rock Pool adjoining the Narrabeen Head Aquatic Reserve, and the Coastal Walk.

Immediately beyond the lagoon entrance lies the world famous North Narrabeen surf break, declared as a National Surfing Reserve in 2009. These Norfolk Pines form a unique visual compass along with other Norfolk Pines in the vicinity, clearly visible from the heritage Rock Pool, the lake front, the Pelican Walk, North Narrabeen Surf Club, and as far away as Powderworks Road, high on the Escarpment to the west.



Comparisons:	Groups of Norfolk pines in Palm Beach, Whale Beach, Bilgola, and Mona Vale are already listed; this North Narrabeen group is at least as significant from a historical, visual, cultural and environmental standpoint. (Schedule 5,
	Pittwater LEP 2014).  Arguably, the only group of similar importance would be the iconic Manly
	Seafront and Esplanade pines, which are also already listed.








Subject of image:	Norfolk Pines North Narrabeen Group of Six from Rock Pool.
