PROPOSED DEVELOPMENT IN DETAIL

The applicant seeks to modify development consent DA2019/0912 granted for alterations and additions to a dwelling house. The modification proposes minor internal layout alterations and the provision of an outdoor air conditioning unit.

No change to the approved built form of the dwelling is proposed.

SITE DESCRIPTION

Property Description:	Lot 44 DP 232584 , 9 Wingara Grove BELROSE NSW 2085
Detailed Site Description:	The subject site is irregular in shape, has an area of 690.5m² and is located on the eastern side of the road within gently sloping topography.
	A one storey dwelling house and swimming pool occupy the mid and rear portions of the site, respectively. Vehicular access to the site is provided from Wingara Grove.
	Landscaping on site includes grass lawn areas and under storey shrubs.
	The site is zoned R2 Low Residential Density and affected by flood.
	Wingara Reserve adjoins the rear eastern boundary of the site and adjoining development to the north and south is characterised by a mixture of modern and traditional style one and two storey dwelling houses in landscaped settings.
