The rezoning of 39 Cabbage Tree Road, Mona Vale to residential is not in the public interest for the following reasons.

- 1. Cabbage Tree Road is and has become a very busy road used as a major thorough fare by traffic taking a short cut from Pittwater Road to Mona Vale Road via Samuel Street and Ingleside. This traffic, even though there is a 50 kilometre speed limit, travel at high speed and there has been many accidents, some fatal along this road. By adding a new residential street entrance opposite unbroken lines, at the bottom of an incline and start of a traffic calming device will increase the risk of sever accidents.
- 2. There are no houses on the opposite side of the road from Parklands Street to Pittwater Road being the western boarder of the golf course and this should be kept this way due to the concerns raised in this letter.
- 3. To allow a residential dwelling on this property would be dangerous, not only from the traffic point of view but also by damage to property and human injury from stray golf balls. My property located on the opposite side of the road has experienced several broken windows and close encounters with personal injury from golf balls. Highlighting the evident danger of a dwelling in the said location.
- 4. The applicant took this property on knowing the zoning was not for residential use and we on the other side of the road took on our properties for the same reason, knowing it was a Private Recreation "B" zoning and no houses would be built there.
- 5. Of great concern, in heavy rain, the said property is prone to extreme flooding, and is zoned accordingly in this regard.
- 6. The erection of a residential dwelling on this land will disrupt local wildlife habitat being bandicoots, birds and possums. Kookaburras will be forced to relocate their young as they use the trees on this property to nest.

I object to 39 Cabbage Tree Road being rezoned from Private Recreation "B" to Residential "A" it is not in the interest of the public, it directly affects the safety of local traffic, residents and the members of the golf course who are also Pittwater rate payers.
