Planning proposal Harbord Beach Hotel.

The current Labor state government has mandated that the whole Sydney area needs affordable housing alternatives, ie dual occupancies and high rise unit complexes. Tell me how this proposal fits that plan. It doesn't.

NOISE

The establishment of a small hotel and pool area will only add to the noise and drunken antics late at night. The residents that own properties near the hotel are also entitled to their rights and privacy late at night.

Freshwater is designated as a R2 Low Density area. This proposal does not fit this criteria and nor is it consistent with the character and use of the area.
