Further to my subsequent submission of. 10/4/2019 sent to you requesting your decision to be reviewed of not to erect " No Parking / No Standing " signs for reasons I outlined . I have not had any reply to that email .

Please find attached photos of 19/6/2019 with Temporary No Parking Signs being totally ignored / blocked from being seen with two / three vehicles ignoring those signs.

I spoke to the person in charge at the time , " Greg " , if he is the site manager he has made no effort to see the temporary signs being adhered to .

They were there for a considerable period of time .







I am extremely concerned when building/ demolishing starts this situation of ignoring No Parking / No Standing will be untenable causing disruption/ inconvenience to my access and much stress each morning wondering if I can get out .

I again request official No Parking / No Standing Signs to be erected by council so they are visible and should be complied with , particularly as building works will take 9-12 months to be completed .

I do not want to be subjected to this stress over such a long period of time each time I wish to use my access . (I suffer from PTSD and have been receiving follow up for this condition over a long period of time and I have been receiving chemotherapy and require further follow up for my CLL .)

I await your review of the situation in light of above .

I acknowledge there will be occasions of delivery / drop off etc , in these cases then the site manager advise of times of disruption the day before .

I would also ask that a condition of approval of D/A 2019 / 0145 be

- 1). No Parking / No Standing Signs be erected .
- 2) No Parking / No Standing Signs be adhered to , as above , responsibility of the site manager .
