Architectural Design Statement Long Reef Golf Club Proposed Re Design

Introduction

The proposal for alterations and additions to the existing Long Reef Golf Club seeks development consent to modernise and enhance the club houses facilities, providing an improved experience for both members and the wider community. The current Clubhouse is outdated, no longer fit for purpose, and unable to meet the evolving needs of its users. This redevelopment will breathe new life into the facility, honouring its legacy while creating a vibrant, contemporary environment that serves the community for generations to come.

Design Concept and Philosophy

At its core, the redesign is about positive transformation. The new clubhouse will feature a two-storey structure that thoughtfully integrates with the surrounding coastal landscape. The alterations will not only address functional shortcomings but also enhance the social and recreational experience for the club's members. By reimagining key spaces such as member facilities, the bar, community rooms, and dining areas, the club will foster a sense of belonging, connection, and enjoyment.

A key feature of the design is the creation of an outdoor covered dining area with associated garden seating, offering members and the community the chance to experience the stunning surroundings while enjoying meals and social gatherings. The addition of a spacious first floor will accommodate multi-use rooms, back-of-house amenities, and a dedicated member's lounge, ensuring the club members can host a variety of events and functions in a flexible, inviting environment.

In keeping with its coastal location and rich cultural heritage, the design draws inspiration from the Inter War Mediterranean style. This style, characterised by its harmonious relationship with the Australian climate and environment, is an ideal fit for the new clubhouse. The Mediterranean aesthetic, with its warm, natural materials and airy, open spaces, will provide a timeless and elegant backdrop that mirrors the coastal beauty of Long Reef.

Key Design Elements

1. Alterations and Additions:

The proposed works will include a comprehensive reconfiguration of the ground floor to provide additional member facilities, bar areas, and community spaces, along with a new lobby entry. These alterations will make the clubhouse more accessible and user-friendly for both members and visitors. Behind the scenes, new operational spaces will ensure efficient day-to-day operations, enhancing the overall functionality of the club.

2. Outdoor Spaces:

A central element of the design is the outdoor covered dining area, offering an opportunity to connect with the natural

environment. Surrounded by lush gardens and seating areas, this space will become a focal point for socialising and enjoying the picturesque coastal landscape.

3. First-Floor Addition:

The proposed first-floor addition will provide essential back-of-house spaces, as well as multi-use rooms and member amenities. It will also house a members' lounge and outdoor terrace areas, each designed to maximise views of the stunning coastal setting.

The redevelopment will prioritise sustainability, including the reuse of solar panels and an environmentally responsible approach to land and tree preservation. The design of the new clubhouse draws upon this essence, evoking a sense of place that harmonizes with the landscape. These buildings are more than just spaces—they are living, breathing parts of the landscape, where the architecture flows with the rhythm of the waves and the wind.

The choice to draw from this architectural language is about capturing the emotion and essence that these pavilions represent—a deep connection to the beach, a sense of welcome, and an openness to all. It's about creating a space that feels as though it has always belonged to the site.

The new clubhouse will embrace these principles of openness, warmth, and coastal beauty, with clean lines, open verandas, and a design that allows the space to breathe and flow.
