This change seems to stem from the expansion of both indoor and outdoor gaming areas. However, this new plan appears to prioritize increasing gaming facilities - both inside and outside - at the expense of vital communal spaces.

Reducing these spaces undermines the club's identity as a family-friendly institution, shifting its focus toward a model that emphasizes gambling rather than community development. This change is particularly troubling in light of increasing public and governmental attention to the negative impacts of gambling on individuals and society. Recent discussions have emphasized the need to mitigate gambling-related harm by prioritizing inclusive, community-centered spaces.

I firmly believe that this development plan should focus more on enhancing areas where families and friends can come together, such as outdoor green spaces, rather than expanding facilities for pokies. Preserving and expanding these spaces is not merely a matter of maintaining the physical environment - it is about safeguarding the essence of what makes the Forestville RSL a true community hub. I urge the club to reconsider this aspect of its development strategy and to realign its priorities with the values of connection, inclusion, and community well-being that have long defined its purpose.

While the club has recently introduced the kids area, this is significantly smaller than the Belrose Hotel and if the club wishes to be a part of the community for years to come it needs to be more progressing - i.e. reducing the large smoking area and focus on pokies.
