Objection to DA2025/0132 - Demolition Works and Construction of a McDonald's Restaurant at 37 Rosebery St, Manly Vale

With growing concerns about obesity and diet-related illnesses, the council should prioritise developments that support healthier food choices and active lifestyles rather than facilitating another fast-food outlet.
