Reasons for referral

This application seeks consent development on land, or within 40m of land, containing:

- All Development Applications on
- Actual or potential threatened species, populations, ecological communities, or their habitats;
- Wildlife corridors;
- Vegetation query stipulating that a Flora and Fauna Assessment is required;
- Vegetation query - X type located in both A & C Wards;

And as such, Council's Natural Environment Unit officers are required to consider the likely potential environmental impacts.

Officer comments

Council's Biodiversity Referrals team have assessed the Development Application for compliance against the following applicable biodiversity related controls:

- Pittwater LEP cl. 7.6 Biodiversity Protection
- Coastal Management SEPP cl. 11 Development on land in proximity to coastal wetlands or littoral rainforest

The Development Application seeks consent for the construction of a new dwelling house. The site is currently cleared of vegetation and therefore will not require the removal of any native, prescribed trees or vegetation, nor will it impact on nearby coastal wetlands or biodiversity values.

Subject to conditions, Council's Biodiversity referrals team are satisfied that the proposed development complies with the above listed biodiversity controls.

The proposal is therefore supported.

No Priority or environmental weeds (as specified in the Northern Beaches Local Weed Management Plan 2021 – 2026) are to be imported on to the site prior to or during construction works.

Details demonstrating compliance are to be submitted to the Principal Certifying Authority prior to issue of any Occupation Certificate.

Reason: To reduce the risk of site works contributing to spread of Priority and environmental weeds.
