We the owners of Apt. #1102/1 Raglan St. Manly N.S.W. 2095 strongly object to the above Development Application. We have many objections some of which are listed below.

Visual Impact & Substantial loss of views to the North of our apartment. We feel that adding extra height (in this case of up to 6.25 meters) to any existing buildings, along the beach front is setting a dangerous precedent which could be and will be used by future developers if this proposed addition is approved by Council.

Manly, which is a World Class Tourist destination, is this because excessive development has been controlled since the mistakes of the 70's & 80's. Our own building The Allegra, The Trident etc. are all blights on the Beach Front. Let's not add to that anymore.

We feel that the Concerns that many Manly Residents had when the Northern Beaches Councils were merged will be validated. As stated above it would be a shame if Council approves this Development as it will set a Dangerous Precedent.


