IMPROVING THE SAFETY OF TREES AROUND YOUR HOUSE

Wind storms can be a most destructive hazard to trees in suburban areas. The most effective measure which can be taken to prevent the damage caused by these wind is to have your trees Crown Thinned. This is a process which removes up to 25% of the tree's foliage and minor branching, as well as any deadwood, weakened or diseased branches. It does not reduce the height of the tree, though the shape of the tree can be greatly improved. Effectively this reduction can be likened to reducing wind in a sail.

The benefits of crown thinning are:

- reduces the wind and rain carrying capacity of trees and hence reduces the likelihood of damage in storms
- can be used to enhance the view through trees
- emphasises the beauty of the stem and structure of the tree
- the many small scars created in a crown thinning operation heal quickly and are less susceptable to attack by wood destroying organisms than large scars
- reduces stress on the root system, this is of particular importance with trees around houses or where changes in drainage patterns may have occured or in developing areas
- encourages the growth of stronger branching and removes weak or dangerous
- allows sunlight in through the tree during winter whilst maintaining shade during summer, this also assists the cultivation of plants and grasses beneath the tree
- can be used to subtly alter the balance of the tree to reduce hazards

In short, crown thinning is a method of hazard reduction, whilst maintaining and improving the environment.

Conversely, lopping, which is the reduction of height and the shortening of branches to stubs with little or no foliage may initially appear to achieve a safer tree but nothing could be further from the truth.

When a tree is lopped one of two things will happen, the tree will die, then presenting a further problem of total removal, or the lopping will act as a stimulus for rapid growth. The resultant growth is from suckers which are attached just beneath the bark, and though these may grow to considerable size they are never an integral part of a tree's structure and are in constant danger of collapse.

The scars created when a tree is lopped may take many years to heal and usually serve as a site of entry for wood destroying organisms, further weakening the tree.

Crown thinning can only be performed by a highly skilled tree surgeon. Tree surgery is not expensive but the price of neglect can be extremely costly, dangerous and disruptive to your environment.
