# Discussion of reason for referral

The proposal has been referred to Heritage as the subject site within the vicinity of two items

**I5 - Bus Shelter -** 800 Pittwater Road (within the road reserve)

149 - Former Wormald Building - 800 Pittwater Road

# Details of heritage items affected

Details of the items as contained within the Warringah inventory is as follows:

#### **Bus Shelter**

#### Statement of Significance

An excellent representative & rare example of a transport shelter in the post-war international style. Designed specifically to complement the adjacent factory & built by the company. Socially important as an e.g. of facilities provided for employees.

#### Physical Description

Cement rendered bus shelter with skillion roof. Open across front with the exception of round structural support columns and a small screen wall with porthole openings. Set into rock at rear. Same design as main factory building.

#### **Former Wormald Building**

#### Statement of Significance

An excellent representative & relatively rare example of early post-war factory architecture. Displays high creative & technical integrity. Historically evidence of the growth of industry in the area. Socially, a landmark which many local people worked in.

# Physical Description

Factory building with rendered masonry walls. Largley single storey with prominent off centre tower with clock, full height steel framed corner windows etc. Assymetrical design. Large straight parapet, continuous bands of metal framed windows. Set up high

The proposal seeks consent for alterations and additions to an existing car dealership including the rebuilding of a showroom, lobby extension and signage. Both heritage items are located to the north east of the property across the Harbord, Pittwater and Warringah Road intersection.
