### Discussion of reason for referral

The proposal has been referred to Heritage as the subject site is within the vicinity of a number of heritage items:

Item I168 - Ocean foreshores - Manly municipal area, boundary adjacent to the ocean

Item I171 - Queenscliff Surf Club - North Steyne, Manly

Item I174 - Beach Reserve - Merrett Park at North Steyne

## Details of heritage items affected

## Item I168 - Ocean foreshores

### Statement of Significance

Natural landscape. Part of coastal zone east coast of Australia. Part entrance to Sydney Harbour. Listed due to its aesthetic, historic, and scientific significance to the area.

#### **Physical Description**

Ocean foreshores, mostly rocky edge and cliff or beach sand system. Natural environment. High scenic quality.

#### Item I171 - Queenscliff Surf Club

## Statement of Significance

A post-modern style building, not architecturally distinguished, but possessing great social significance.

### **Physical Description**

Completed in the 1990. A large two storey cement rendered post-modern style building with rectangular columns to colonnade extending around the building's beach front with terrace above and a corner clock, tower facing the beach. The street front has a curvilinear wave form to the ground floor, front, a setback curved corrugated colour bond roof form and clear storey above. A small gabled parapet with semicircular opening defines the entry. The SLSC has operated since 1877.

#### Item I174 - Beach Reserve

## Statement of Significance

High significance as natural sand beach and cultural backdrop of paved promenade and first coastal plantings of Norfolk Island Pines.

#### **Physical Description**

Beachfront, promonade, sandstone retaining wall, paved, grassed And/or planting beds and remnant plantings of Norfolk Island Pines planted from the 1850's to the 1880's.

This proposal seeks consent to modify the approved Development Application DA2023/1275. The proposed modification involves relocating the bin storage room into the basement. The works will involve the demolition of the existing external bin storage and the construction of a new bin storage area within the existing visitor parking location in the basement.
