SCHEDULE 8 COMMERCIAL AND INDUSTRIAL ALTERATIONS CODE AND THE COMMERCIAL AND INDUSTRIAL (NEW BUILDINGS AND ADDITIONS) CODE

Conditions of Complying Development Certificate as required by the State Environmental Planning Policy (Exempt and Complying Development Codes)

Conditions applying before works commence

Protection of adjoining areas

A temporary hoarding or temporary construction site fence must be erected between the work site and adjoining lands before the works begin and must be kept in place until after the completion of the

- (a) could cause a danger, obstruction or inconvenience to pedestrian or vehicular traffic, or
- (b) could cause damage to adjoining lands by falling objects, or
- (c) involve the enclosure of a public place or part of a public place.

Note. Clauses 2.67 and 2.68 of this Policy specify which scaffolding, hoardings and temporary construction site fences are exempt development and state the applicable standards for that

Toilet facilities

- (1) Toilet facilities must be available or provided at the work site before works begin and must be maintained until the works are completed at a ratio of one toilet plus one additional toilet for every 20 persons employed at the site. (2) Each toilet must:
- - (a) be a standard flushing toilet connected to a public sewer, or
 - (b) have an on-site effluent disposal system approved under the Local Government Act 1993, or
 - (c) be a temporary chemical closet approved under the Local Government Act 1993.

Waste management

- (1) A waste management plan for the work must be submitted to the principal certifying authority at least 2 days before work commences on the site (2) The waste management plan must:
- - (a) identify all waste (including excavation, demolition and construction waste materials) that will be generated by the work on the site, and
 - (b) identify the quantity of waste material in tonnes and cubic metres to be:
 - (i) reused on-site, and
 - (ii) recycled on-site and off-site, and
 - (iii) disposed of off-site, and
 - (c) if waste materials are to be reused or recycled on-site—specify how the waste material will be
 - (d) if waste materials are to be disposed of or recycled off-site—specify the contractor who will be transporting the materials and the waste facility or recycling outlet to which the materials will
- (3) A garbage receptacle must be provided at the work site before works begin and must be maintained until the works are completed.
- (4) The garbage receptacle must have a tight fitting lid and be suitable for the reception of food

Adjoining wall dilapidation report

(1) Before commencing any demolition or excavation works, the person having the benefit of the complying development certificate must obtain a dilapidation report on any part of a building that is within 2m of the works.

(2) If the person preparing the report is denied access to the building for the purpose of an inspection, the report may be prepared from an external inspection. Run-off and erosion controls

Run-off and erosion controls must be implemented to prevent soil erosion, water pollution or the discharge of loose sediment on the surrounding land by:

- (a) diverting uncontaminated run-off around cleared or disturbed areas, and
- (b) erecting a silt fence and providing any other necessary sediment control measures that will prevent debris escaping into drainage systems, waterways or adjoining properties, and
- (c) preventing the tracking of sediment by vehicles onto roads, and
- (d) stockpiling top soil, excavated materials, construction and landscaping supplies and debris within

Conditions applying during the works

Note. The <u>Protection of the Environment Operations Act 1997</u> and the <u>Protection of the Environment</u> Operations (Noise Control) Regulation 2008 contain provisions relating to noise. Standard hours for construction

Construction may only be carried out between 7.00 am and 6.00 pm on Monday to Friday, or between 8.00 am and 1.00 pm on Saturdays, and no construction is to be carried out at any time on a Sunday or a public holiday. Works outside standard hours for construction

- (1) Work may be carried out outside the standard hours for construction if the work only generates
 - (a) no louder than 5 dB(A) above the rating background level at any adjoining residence in accordance with the Interim Construction Noise Guideline (ISBN 978 1 74232 217
 - 9) published by the Department of Environment and Climate Change NSW in July 2009, and
 - (b) no louder than the noise management levels specified in Table 3 of that guideline at other
- (2) Work may be carried out outside the standard hours for construction:
 - (a) for the delivery of materials—if prior approval has been obtained from the NSW Police Force
- (b) in an emergency, to avoid the loss of lives or property or to prevent environmental harm. Compliance with plans

Works must be carried out in accordance with the plans and specifications to which the complying development certificate relates. Demolition

Any demolition must be carried out in accordance with AS 2601—2001, The demolition of structures. Maintenance of site

- (1) All materials and equipment must be stored wholly within the work site unless an approval to store
- (2) Waste materials (including excavation, demolition and construction waste materials) must be managed on the site and then disposed of at a waste management facility.
- (3) Copies of receipts stating the following must be given to the principal certifying authority: (a) the place to which waste materials were transported,

 - (b) the name of the contractor transporting the materials,
 - (c) the quantity of materials transported off-site and recycled or disposed of.
- (4) Any run-off and erosion control measures required must be maintained within their operating capacity until the completion of the works to prevent debris escaping from the site into drainage (5) During construction:
 - (a) all vehicles entering or leaving the site must have their loads covered, and

- (b) all vehicles, before leaving the site, must be cleaned of dirt, sand and other materials, to avoid
- (6) At the completion of the works, the work site must be left clear of waste and debris.

Earthworks, retaining walls and structural support

- (1) Any earthworks (including any structural support or other related structure for the purposes of the
 - (a) must not cause a danger to life or property or damage to any adjoining building or structure on the lot or to any building or structure on any adjoining lot, and
 - (b) must not redirect the flow of any surface or ground water or cause sediment to be transported
 - (c) that is fill brought to the site—must contain only virgin excavated natural material (VENM) as defined in Part 3 of Schedule 1 to the Protection of the Environment Operations Act 1997, and
 - (d) that is excavated soil to be removed from the site—must be disposed of in accordance with any requirements under the Protection of the Environment Operations (Waste) Regulation
- (2) Any excavation must be carried out in accordance with Excavation Work: Code of Practice (ISBN 978-0-642-785442 [PDF] and ISBN 978-0-642-785459 [DOCX]), published in July 2012 by Safe Drainage connections

- (1) If the work is the erection of, or an alteration or addition to, a building, the roof stormwater drainage system must be installed and connected to the drainage system before the roof is
- (2) Any approval that is required for connection to the drainage system under the Local Government Act 1993 must be held before the connection is carried out.

Archaeology discovered during excavation

If any object having interest due to its age or association with the past is uncovered during the course (a) all work must stop immediately in that area, and

- (b) the Office of Environment and Heritage must be advised of the discovery. Note. Depending on the significance of the object uncovered, an archaeological assessment and excavation permit under the Heritage Act 1997 may be required before further the work can

Aboriginal objects discovered during excavation

If any Aboriginal object (including evidence of habitation or remains) is discovered during the course

- (a) all excavation or disturbance of the area must stop immediately in that area, and
- (b) the Office of Environment and Heritage must be advised of the discovery in accordance with section 89A of the National Parks and Wildlife Act 1974.

Note. If an Aboriginal object is discovered, an Aboriginal heritage impact permit may be required When a survey certificate is required

- (1) If any part of the work is the erection of a new building, or an alteration or addition to an existing building, that is located less than 3m from the lot boundary, a survey certificate must be given to the principal certifying authority:
 - (a) before any form work below the ground floor slab is completed, or
 - (b) if there is no such form work—before the concrete is poured for the ground floor slab.

(2) The survey certificate must be prepared by a registered land surveyor and show the location of

Conditions applying before the issue of an occupation certificate Vehicular access

If the work involves the construction of a vehicular access point, the access point must be completed before the occupation certificate for the work on the site is obtained.

- (1) If the work requires alteration to, or the relocation of, utility services on, or adjacent to, the lot on which the work is carried out, the work is not complete until all such works are carried out.
- (2) If the work will be the subject of a notice of requirements for water supply or sewerage services (or both) by a water utility or an entity authorised by the utility, the work must be satisfactorily completed before the occupation certificate is issued.
- (3) If the work will be the subject of a compliance certificate under section 73 of the Sydney Water Act 1994, the work must be satisfactorily completed before the occupation certificate is issued.

Mechanical ventilation systems

If the work includes a mechanical ventilation system that is a regulated system within the meaning of the <u>Public Health Act 2010</u>, the system must be notified as required by the <u>Public Health Regulation</u> 2012, before an occupation certificate (whether interim or final) for the work is issued.

If the work relates to a **food business** within the meaning of the <u>Food Act 2003</u>, the food business must be notified as required by that Act, or licensed as required by the Food Regulation 2010, before an occupation certificate (whether interim or final) for the work is issued.

Premises where skin penetration procedures are carried out

If the work relates to premises at which a skin penetration procedure, within the meaning of the Public Health Act 2010, will be carried out, the premises must be notified as required by Part 4 of the Public Health Regulation 2012 before an occupation certificate (whether interim or final) for the

Operational requirements

Hours of operation

- (1) If there are existing conditions on a development consent applying to hours of operation, the development must not be operated outside the hours specified in those conditions.
- (2) If there are no existing conditions on a development consent applying to hours of operation, the development must not be operated outside the following hours:
 - (a) if the development involves a new use as bulky goods premises or other commercial premises—7.00 am to 10.00 pm Monday to Saturday and 7.00 am to 8.00 pm on a Sunday or
 - (b) if the development involves a new use as something other than a bulky goods premises or other commercial premises and adjoins or is opposite a residential lot within a residential zone or Zone RU5 Village—7.00 am to 7.00 pm Monday to Saturday and no operation on a Sunday
- (c) in any other case not referred to in paragraph (a) or (b)—7.00 am to 7.00 pm Monday to Saturday and 9.00 am to 6.00 pm on a Sunday or a public holiday.

Noise

- (1) The development must comply with the requirements for industrial premises contained in the (2) Noise emitted by the development:
- - (a) must not exceed an L A (15 min) of 5dB(A) above background noise when measured at any lot boundary of the property where the development is being carried out, and

- (b) must not cause the relevant amenity criteria in Table 2.1 in the Noise Policy to be exceeded. (3) In this clause, the Noise Policy means the document entitled NSW Industrial Noise Policy (ISBN
- 0 7313 2715 2) published in January 2000 by the Environment Protection Authority. Lighting

- (1) All new external lighting must:
 - (a) comply with AS 4282-1997 Control of the obtrusive effects of outdoor lighting, and
 - (b) be mounted, screened and directed in a way that it does not create a nuisance or light spill on
- (2) Lighting at vehicle access points to the development must be provided in accordance with AS/NZS 1158 Set:2010 Lighting for roads and public spaces Set.

Unobstructed driveways and parking areas

- (1) All driveways and parking areas must be unobstructed at all times.
 - (a) must not be used for the manufacture, storage or display of goods, materials or any other
 - (b) must be used solely for vehicular access and for the parking of vehicles associated with the

Landscaped area (planting and maintenance)

- (1) Any tree or shrub that fails to establish within 2 years of the initial planting date must be replaced (2) All landscaped areas on the site must be maintained on an on-going basis.

DIVISION 2A CONDITIONS OF COMPLYING DEVELOPMENT CERFICATE

Prescribed conditions under the EP&A Regulation 2000

Compliance with the BCA and insurance requirements under the Home Building Act 1989 (cl.136A)

- All building work must be carried out in accordance with the requirements of the Building Code 1. of Australia.
- A contract of insurance in accordance with Part 6 of the Home Building Act 1989 must be in 2. force before any building work authorised to be carried out by the certificate commences.
- The temporary structure to be used as an entertainment venue must comply with Part B1 and 3. NSW Part H102 of Volume One of the Building Code of Australia, as in force on the date the application for the relevant complying development certificate was made.

Notice to Neighbours (cl.136AB)

For land that is not within a 'residential release area' as defined in clause 136AB(3) of the Regulation:

The person having the benefit of the CDC must give at least 7 days' notice in writing of the intention to commence the work authorised by the certificate to the occupier of each dwelling that is located on a lot that has a boundary within 20 metres of the boundary of the lot on which the work is to be carried out

For land that is within a 'residential release area' as defined in clause 136AB(3) of the Regulation:

The person having the benefit of the CDC must give at least 2 days' notice in writing of the intention to commence the work authorised by the certificate to the occupier of each dwelling that is located on a lot that has a boundary within 20 metres of the boundary of the lot on which the work is to be carried out.

Note: Evidence of the notification of the commencement of works is to be provided to the principal certifying authority. This should include a copy of the notice and a record of the property address and delivery date for each notice provided.

If the development involves any building work subdivision work or demolition work, other than work carried out inside a building that does not affect its external walls, or the work is Crown building work, the following two conditions apply: Erection of signs (cl.136B)

- A sign must be erected in a prominent position on any site on which building work, subdivision work or demolition work is being carried out:
 - showing the name, address and telephone number of the principal certifying authority for a) the work, and
 - showing the name of the principal contractor (if any) for any building work and a b) telephone number on which that person may be contacted outside working hours, and
 - stating that unauthorised entry to the site is prohibited.
- Any such sign is to be maintained while the building work, subdivision work or demolition work is being carried out, but must be removed when the work has been completed.

Note: Principal contractors must also ensure that signs required by these conditions are erected and maintained (see clause 227A of the Regulation which currently imposes a maximum penalty of \$1,100).

Notification of Home Building Act 1989 requirements (cl.136C)

- 7. Building work must not be carried out unless the principal certifying authority (if it is not the council) has given the council written notice of the following information:
 - (a) in the case of work for which a principal contractor is required to be appointed:
 - (i) the name and licence number of the principal contractor, and
 - (ii) the name of the insurer by which the work is insured under Part 6 of the Home Building Act 1989 Act,
 - (b) in the case of work to be done by an owner-builder:
 - (i) the name of the owner-builder, and
 - (ii) if the owner-builder is required to hold an owner-builder permit under that Act, the number of the owner-builder permit.
- 8. If arrangements for doing the building work are changed while the work is in progress, further work must not be carried out unless the principal certifying authority (if it is not the council) has given the council written notice of the updated information.

9. Fulfilment of BASIX commitments (cl. 136D)

The commitments listed in the BASIX certificate(s) in relation to the approved development must be fulfilled

Note: The BASIX certificate(s) listed above relate to the development and the commitments are required to be fulfilled as part of the development, and prior to the issue of an occupation certificate for the development.

10. Removal of bonded and friable asbestos material (cl.136E)

- (a) Work involving bonded asbestos removal work (of an area of more than 10 square metres) or friable asbestos removal work must be undertaken by a person who carries on a business of such removal work in accordance with a licence under clause 458 of the Work Health and Safety Regulation 2011.
- (b) The person having the benefit of the complying development certificate must provide the principal certifying authority with a copy of a signed contract with the person who will carry out the removal work before any work authorised by the certificate commences.
- (c) Any contract must indicate whether any bonded asbestos material or friable asbestos material will be removed, and if so, must specify the landfill site (that may lawfully receive asbestos) to which the material is to be delivered,
- (d) If bonded asbestos material or friable asbestos material will be removed to a specified landfill site, the person having the benefit of the complying development certificate must give the principal certifying authority a copy of a receipt from the operator of the landfill site stating that all the asbestos material referred to in the contract has been received by the operator.

Note 1: In this condition 'bonded asbestos material', 'bonded asbestos removal work', 'friable asbestos material' and 'friable asbestos removal work' have the same meanings as in clause 317 of the Occupational Health and Safety Regulation 2001.

Note 2: Under clause 317 removal work refers to work in which the bonded asbestos material or friable asbestos material is removed, repaired or disturbed.

Note 3: The development will be a workplace to which the Occupational Health and Safety Regulation 2001 applies while removal work involving bonded asbestos material or friable asbestos material is being undertaken.

Note 4: Information on the removal and disposal of asbestos to landfill sites licensed to accept this waste is available from the Office of Environment and Heritage.

Note 5: Demolition undertaken in relation to complying development under the State Environmental Planning Policy (Exempt and Complying Development Codes) 2008 must be carried out in accordance with Australian Standard AS 2601-2001, Demolition of structures.

11. Shoring and adequacy of adjoining property (cl.136H)

If the development involves an excavation that extends below the level of the base of the footings of a building, structure or work (including any structure or work within a road or rail corridor) on adjoining land, the person having the benefit of the certificate must at the person's own expense:

- a) protect and support the building, structure or work from possible damage from the excavation, and
- b) where necessary, underpin the building, structure or work to prevent any such damage. **Note:** The requirements of this condition do not apply if the person having the benefit of the CDC owns the adjoining land or the owner of the adjoining land has given consent in writing to this condition not applying.

If the development was required to be accompanied by a certificate from Roads and Maritime Services as required by clause 4(1)(k) of Schedule 1 of the Regulation, then the following condition applies:

12. Roads and Maritime Services certificate – traffic generation (cl.136l)

The requirements specified in any applicable certificate of Roads and Maritime Services must be complied with as part of undertaking the development:

Note: Where the Roads and Maritime Services certificate specifies that the person having the benefit of the CDC is to enter into a separate agreement with Roads and Maritime Services, evidence that the agreement has been formally entered into should be provided to the principal certifying authority prior to the commencement of works.

If the development was required to be accompanied by a statement of a qualified person in relation to potential land contamination as required by clause 4(1)(I) of Schedule 1 of the Regulation, then the following condition applies:

13. Development on contaminated land (cl.136J)

(a) The requirements specified in any applicable statement must be complied with as part of undertaking the development

Note: In addition to any matters specified in the statement, any remediation works must be carried out in accordance with the requirements of clauses 16, 17 and 18 of *State Environmental Planning Policy No. 55 – Remediation of Land,* including the guidelines in force under the <u>Contaminated Land Management Act 1997.</u>

14. Contributions and levies (cl136K & 136L)

- (a) A monetary contribution under section 94 of the Act or a levy under section 94A of the Act in accordance with Council's contribution plan may be required for the development authorised by this certificate.
- (b) Before any work authorised by this certificate commences, the person with the benefit of this certificate must provide the Principal Certifying Authority with written evidence from the Council confirming whether or not a contribution or level is payable under the contributions plan, the amount of that monetary contribution or levy and the applicable indexation of that amount.

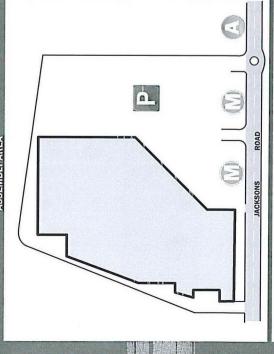

If the severity of smoke or heat warrants further evacuation, occupants and visitors should be moved to safe areas on the same level.

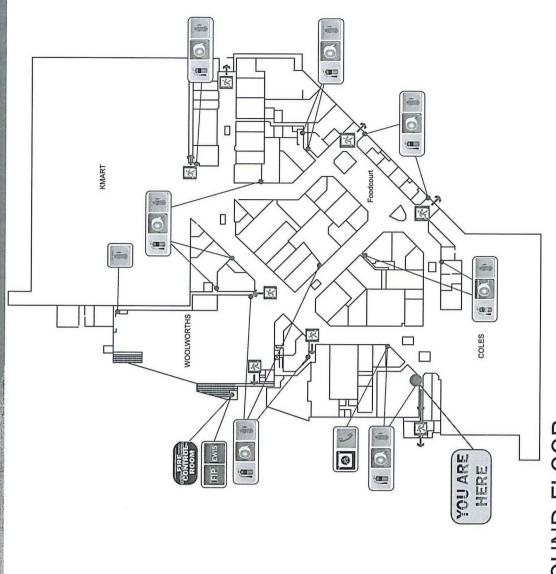
STAGE 3 - COMPLETE EVACUATION OF THE FLOOR

Should the emergency necessitate evacuation of the affected floor, Wardens are to direct occupants to the assembly area via the emergency exits.
