# <u>Application for Tree Removal – by Vigen and Rosie Evanian</u> <u>Norfolk Island Pine</u>

## 9 Haigh Avenue, Belrose

There are a number of reasons for considering the approval to remove the abovementioned tree.

### 1. The Health Issues of our Son

The Pine tree is located just outside our son's bedroom and he suffers severe eczema and dermatitis. We have spent thousands of dollars trying to treat or control his skin issues and have yet another specialist's appointment in December. He is limited by playing outside due to the Pine tree's long needle pods that cover the ground area and seem to flare up his skin disorder. (see Picture 5).

### 2. Water logged under the house

A few years ago our son contracted "Kawasaki Disease" – a very rare disease that is still being researched. He almost died. But for the rest of his life will need to have regular heart checks. The cause is yet unknown but one theory is a certain bacteria caused by stagnant water. We have only recently discovered that there is water sitting under his bedroom due to improper drainage due to pipes being blocked by the pine tree roots. We have had to dig an alternative trench to drain out the water after heavy rains. (see Picture 6)

### 3. Mold Spores and Mildew very present on trunk

It seems the trunk of the tree has had a fungal attack and we are concerned with the airborne effects of the mold and mildew that is covered all over the trunk – again for the health of our son. (see Picture 4)

### 4. The tree Position

The tree is located about six and a half meters away from the house and is also very close to the pathway where lots of local children ride their bikes etc. This is also a bus stop. We are concerned for the safety of our

three children and the neighborhood, that if the tree ever fell, it is slanted towards the footpath, road and telegraph pole - it can cause major chaos. (see Picture 1)

## 5. Electricity lines

There are electricity power lines both on our land and on council property running directly through the tree canopy, which is also quite dangerous in case of a heavy storm. (see Picture 2)

Therefore, we kindly request that Council will consider the 5 mentioned reasons that we would like the Norfolk Pine tree to be removed. We understand that it may be a considerable cost to us to have the tree cut down, however we feel our son's health and the safety of our neighbors is more important. We hope that you will too.

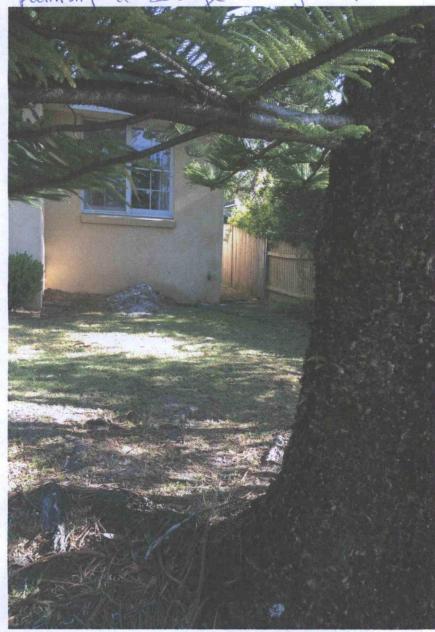

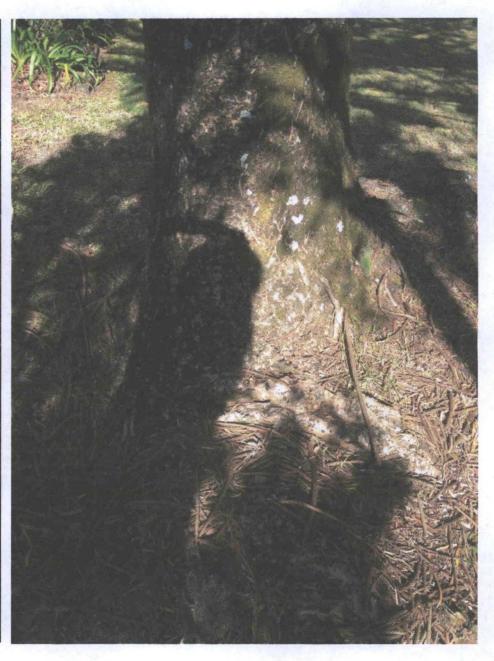




(3) Tree roots reach the house causing pipe issues both to plumbing a sewrage reaching footpath.
