

BROOKVALE PUBLIC SCHOOL HALL OPTIONS ANALYSIS

INTRODUCTION

The Brookvale Public school site has received funding by Schools Infrastructure New South Wales (SINSW) to provide a new hall that caters for the student population. The existing hall is obsolete and inadequate to provide contemporary learning and deliver the curriculum for future teaching pedagogies.

Factors contributing to the analysis of the appropriate school hall location are as follows:

The school needs to have a hall but also must - School: consider the important need to retain green Open Play Space for the active students. The Hall needs to

provide flexible educational options to enhance delivery of the curriculum. Maintain the required Open Play Space for students.

EFSG (Educational Facilities Standards and Guidelines) core principals need to be considered -

see associated diagram.

- Social: Social connectivity and practical placement of the hall to allow for the greatest multifunctional use. The Hall must not limit the potential sharing of Open Play Space to the wider community nor can it significantly

reduce the facility.

- Site Context: Sensitivity of social, visual, acoustic relationship with


neighbours. The hall design must be sensitive to its relationship with neighbours and adjoining properties.


- Community: Tree retention, where possible, to maximise

neighbourhood quality.



Remote from core school activities, not physically/ socially/ visually connected to school.

Existing play equipment needs to be relocated

Doesn't comply with the Dept. of Education EFSG (Educational Facilities Standards & Guidelines) relationship to core facilities.

This option received an unfavourable response from the School teaching staff and P&C Committee.






ASSESSMENT

Minimal impact on Green Open Play Space. Continued existing use of oval as a valuable sports playing field.



2 original QLD Brushbox trees removed, 1 standard QLD Brushbox tree removed.

1 dead tree removed.







SITE PLAN 1:500 scale

This option was rejected for safety concerns.













Doesn't interfere with green play space

- Remote from school activities, not physically/ socially/ visually connected to school. Doesn't comply with the Dept. of Education EFSG relationship to core facilities.
- Cannot safely build too close to existing building and will disrupt the running of the school during construction.
 - The Out of Hours school care and the demountable buildings will need to be relocated for duration of construction. Demountable buildings would need permanent relocation.
- 2 trees trees removed Swamp mahogany and Scribbly gum
- Takes up small but important active playground
- Existing play equpment needs to be relocated
- Concerns of no line of sight to rear area behind proposed hall. Doesn't adhere to Crime Prevention Through Environmental Design principals.
















Interferes with Green play space. Compromised shape of the green play space is not condusive to playing mini soccer and reduces usability of the field. Not proportionally acceptable





ASSESSMENT

Doesn't interfere with green play space

Connected with school activities, physically/ socially/ visually connected to school. Accessible and inclusive to all parts of the school.

Resource inefficiancy due to demolishing and replacing existing facilities.

Play equipment needs to be relocated

Scope for larger audiences to bleed into the green play space.

Considerable build structure divides school. Playground supervision would need to double and line of sight is lost from one area to another.

Safety and security concerns. Toilet entrances under hall will be obscured from a distance.

Existing student toilets will need temporary relocation during construction.

Outdoor seating area under the COLA is not level with the hall prohibiting smooth flow-through betwen hall and green play space.

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

BROOKVALE PUBLIC SCHOOL HALL LOCATION SUMMARY

After thorough considered assessment of all locations researching pros and cons of each site the clear most suitable location for the new hall is Option 2.

Factors contributing to the most appropriate school hall location are as follows:

- School: Optimal use of the Open Play Space is maintained with Option 2. As the Hall can have

fully openable walls, the hall can add activity to the Open Play Space. This benefits the neighbourhood and community allowing for the 'Share our Space' initiative by the NSw Dept of Education, to continue allowing the local community recreational use of the grounds on weekends. This option also successfully follows the EFSG Guildeline's core

principles for delivery of the education curiculum.

- Social: Social connectivity is achieved with Option 2. The hall placement allows for

multifunctional use, for the school and for the greater community out of hours. Larger performances and events can occur due to the the opening of the walls allowing for

greater audience capacity to bleed into the Open Play Space.

- Site Context: Site context has been considered in detail.

Lower height rooms situated next to the boundary allows for break in form and reduction of scale maintaining neighbours privacy. Building height is considered and adheres to Council's development control plans.

Openable walls are not adjacent to neighbours boundaries or adjoining properties providing acoustic privacy.

- Community: Whilst some mature trees are proposed to be removed, these are deep in the site and not on the street boundary.

The noted heritage item, the 1902 building in the south eastern corner of the site, is preserved to recognise the school's history. The site affords considerable existing trees and whilst tree retention is important we believe the minimal considered removal of these particular trees create the best outcomes for the school, neighbourhood and wider community.
