I am writing in response to the Review of Determination of Modification 2018/432 regarding the relocation of the rooftop Air Conditioning Units to the east and north facing ground level terraces of the new townhouses.

I support the IPM Holdings Pty Ltd letter of 7 June 2019 requesting that council work with the developer, neighbours and residents to find a more skilful outcome than the one currently proposed and endorsed by council in the determination of MOD 2018/0432.

Future outcomes could encompass a range of practical strategies to deal with the encumbrance of locating all the units in the rooftop. These outcomes could include

- Locating some of the units in the basement, as long as our exhaust system can take them in the garage.
- Locating some of the AC units in the garden areas, if owners agree to this
- Leaving some of the AC Units on the roof which are under the height restriction, reconfiguring to reduce the visual impacts to the neighbours, the ones that are above height restrictions have another lower unit in its place.

The currently proposed location on the eastern and northern ground level terraces will present a significant impost to the amenity of all the neighbouring properties around the development particularly to the properties to the east on Wyndora and Coles Roads.

These AC units are not to be confused with small 'split' system type AC units which are sometimes located on the balconies of unit developments. These are significant pieces of plant - to demonstrate I have attached a render of the relocated AC unit in the proposed location on a rear terrace of the development. As you can see, the bulk and scale of the AC unit will dominate the terrace architecturally and image sitting out on your terrace while the unit is

on,the noise and heat will make the terrace area unbearable and reduce the area of the balcony, it will also acoustically infringe on the amenity of those neighbouring properties on ground level to the east of the development. Particularly as these neighbours will have 13 of these units located only a few meters from their properties.

As such, I urge you to reject the current proposal to relocate all the AC units on the rear terraces and to inform the developers of Northern Beaches Council's willingness to work with them and the key stakeholders over the next couple of months to arrive at a more thoughtful and sensible outcome.
