Submission to Development Application DA2015/0597 – Alterations and Additions to Manly Vale **Public School**

Dear Sir/Madam,

The Nature Conservation Council of NSW (NCC) is the peak environment organisation for New South Wales, representing 150 member societies across the state. Together we are committed to protecting and conserving the wildlife, landscapes and natural resources of NSW.

We welcome the opportunity to comment on the Development Application for alterations and additions to Manly Vale Public School, DA2015/0597 (the DA) during this period of public notification.

Issues concerning the DA have been raised with us by our member groups in the region. They pertain to:

- the impacts on threatened species listed under state and federal legislation,
- the continued degradation and incremental loss of biodiversity in the Warringah Local Government Area¹ in areas of high conservation bushland,
- the adequacy of Ameliorative Measures to mitigate biodiversity impacts, when the **DA** has not co-ordinated or discussed an offset strategy with the proponent or the Office of Environment and Heritage, and
- the inadequacy of species surveys at this point in time there remain further surveys on threatened plant species that must be completed before an accurate account of the biodiversity value of the site can be determined.

NCC has significant concerns with the extent of clearing associated with this DA and associated impacts on biodiversity and threatened species. We do not support the application.

We note that similar concerns were raised by the Council's Natural Environment Unit who concludes that "the adverse impacts upon the natural environment are significant and therefore the development application is not supported"³.

We urge council to recognise the significant impacts this DA will have on the natural environment, including the long term and cumulative impacts of clearing and associated habitat loss, and follow the advice of the Natural Environment Unit by refusing the application.
