I oppose this application for the following reasons:

- 1. The Forestville RSL club currently has a large amount of open outdoor space ideal for children and families. It adjoins other green space including council reserve, sporting oval and a scouts hall. There are large trees and lots of birds and other wildlife that inhabits these areas. The area is well used by the local community. This development will adversely impact the natural environment and surrounding areas by decreasing green space and increasing the built environment in the area.
- 2. The area is a community hub and the development will detract from this facility with substantial increases to the built environment and reducing green space.
- 3. The large outdoor and indoor areas of the current RSL club have only recently been redeveloped creating wonderful family friendly spaces both inside the club and in the outdoor dining and recreation areas.
