Reasons for referral

This application seeks consent for any application on land or land being adjoining or adjacent to any parks, reserves, beaches, or foreshore
And as such, Council's Parks, Reserves and Foreshores officers are required to consider the likely impacts of the proposal.

Officer comments

The development site adjoins East McCarrs Creek Reserve that is located upslope of the property.

No physical encroachments over the site boundaries are permitted, and structures and built elements are not permitted beyond the site boundaries.

The development is not detrimental to the prevailing landscape character when viewed from the adjoining Reserve as the existing bushland of the Reserve remains intact and existing trees are preserved within the property at the rear to provide a landscape transition, and as such Parks, Reserves and Foreshores raise no concerns with the development proposal.

The proposal is therefore supported.

Parks, Reserves and Foreshores Conditions:

CONDITIONS TO BE COMPLIED WITH DURING DEMOLITION AND BUILDING WORK

No Access Through Land Owned or Managed by Council

Site access is not approved for delivery of materials nor construction of the development through adjacent land owned or managed by Council, without the written approval of Council.

Reason: Public safety, landscape amenity and tree protection.

Storage of Materials on Land Owned or Managed by Council Prohibited

The dumping or storage of building materials, spoil, vegetation, green waste or any other material in land owned or managed by Council is prohibited.

Reason: Public safety and environmental protection.

Protection of Council's Public Assets

Any damage to Council's public assets shall be made good by the applicant, and/or the contractor, to the satisfaction of Council.

Council's public assets include, but is not limited to, the following: road, kerb and gutters, crossovers, crossings, paths, grass verge, open space and associated elements such as furniture, recreational facilities and the like, within the meaning of the Local Government Act 1993. Existing trees shall be protected in accordance with AS4970 Protection of Trees on Development Sites, with no ground intrusion into the tree protection zone and no trunk, branch nor canopy disturbance.

Reason: To protect and/or restore any damaged public asset.
